Cyfeiriodd y Cyfarwyddwr yr Aelodau at adran 4.3 yr adroddiad lle mae arolygiadau o eiddo a thor rheolau'n cael eu hamlinellu. Cafodd yr Aelodau wybod bod y gyfradd cyflawni gyfredol yn parhau i fod yn 90.5% gan fod cyn lleied o arolygiadau wedi'u cwblhau yn ystod y cyfnod, o ganlyniad i'r ffaith bod gofyn i dafarndai, clybiau a bwytai gau yn sgil cyfarwyddiadau'r Llywodraeth ac wrth i swyddogion ganolbwyntio ar arolygiadau Covid-19.

Aeth y Cyfarwyddwr ymlaen i ddisgrifio'r sefyllfa yn ystod y cyfnod yma, gan egluro bod yr holl dafarndai, clybiau a bwytai trwyddedig wedi rhoi'r gorau i fasnachu o ganlyniad i'r cyfyngiadau gan Lywodraeth Cymru er mwyn mynd i'r afael â phandemig y coronafeirws. Er i'r mangreoedd yma gael eu cau, cafodd Aelodau wybod bod swyddogion wedi parhau i gynnal ymweliadau, ynghyd â charfan gorfodi RhCT a Heddlu De Cymru, i sicrhau'u bod yn cydymffurfio â Covid.

16 Chair Welcome

The Chair took the opportunity to welcome the Temporary Health Protection and Licensing Manager to the meeting.

17 Declaration of Interest

In accordance with the Council's Code of Conduct, there were no declarations made pertaining to the agenda.

18 Human Rights Act 1997 and Crime and Disorder Act

It was **RESOLVED** to note that when Members determine the licensing and registration matters before them, they have a duty not to act in a manner that is incompatible with the convention on Human Rights and the Crime and Disorder Act.

19 Minutes

It was **RESOLVED** to approve the minutes of the 2nd February 2021 as an accurate reflection of the meeting.

20 Review of the Licensing Act 2003 & Gambling Act 2005

The Director, Public Health, Protection and Community Services provided the

Committee with the report on relevant issues with regard to the Licensing Act 2003 and the Gambling Act 2005, together with ancillary matters arising from the responsibilities charged to the Committee.

It was reported that the number of Temporary Events Notices (TEN's) during the period were low, with only 10 applications submitted. This could be attributed to the Coronavirus Regulations that restrict licenced activities. However, with the agreement for licensed premises to resume trade in outside areas only, it was envisaged there would be an increase in such applications during the next period; in particular for clubs, who have different conditions of licence compared to pubs and restaurants. The Director also noted that the number of transfers and changes of DPS was considerable, which again, was likely due to the uncertain nature of the pub/club trade as a result of the pandemic.

The Director reported that since the last Committee report, there had been one contested application for Variation of a Premises Licence. It was also reported that there had been two reviews, requested by South Wales Police, during the period. The first review was for the Red Lion, Treforest, whereby the Sub-Committee determined to revoke the Licence; and the second was for the White Lion Hotel, Aberdare, whereby the Sub-Committee determined to revoke the Licence. Members were informed that the applicant for the White Lion Hotel had since appealed against the decision of the Licensing Act Committee to revoke the premises licence and the Hearing would take place at 10am on 12th May, 2021 at Merthyr Tydfil Law Courts.

The Director referred Members to section 4.3 of the report, where the premises inspections and infringements were outlined. Members learned that the current performance level remained at 90.5% as there had been minimal inspections carried out during the period, due to the enforced closure by Government of pubs, clubs & restaurants and officers focusing on Covid-19 inspections.

The Director went on to describe the situation for the Trade during the period, explaining that all licensed pubs, clubs and restaurants had ceased trading due to the restrictions imposed by Welsh Government to combat the coronavirus pandemic. Despite the closures, Members were informed that officers had continued to conduct Covid compliance visits, along with the RCT Covid Enforcement Team and South Wales Police, known as the joint enforcement team (JET).

The Director informed the Committee of the latest lifting of restrictions and the queries received from the trade during the period in relation to clubs re-opening outdoors. Members learned that the mandatory conditions imposed on club premises certificates differed from pubs and restaurants which hindered the possibility of many clubs opening outdoors during the coming weeks.

In relation to the re-opening outdoors of pubs and restaurants, the Director advised the Committee that issues had arisen regarding the erection of outdoor gazebo style areas. Members were referred to Section 4.4 of the report, which displayed a visual aid of what is appropriate and explained that a gazebo requires 51% open sides.

In terms of the recovery of annual fees, Members were reminded that the Licensing department had initially taken the decision to not chase immediate payment of the fees during the past year due to the economic hardship placed on premises, but had to begin chasing payments due to Legislation

requirements. It was noted that the total income received as at 31st March 2021 was £127,240, which was attributed to the hard work of the team.

Members noted that there were no significant changes in terms of the Gambling Act 2005. Members were advised that the local RCT statement of principles was due for review by January 2022 and that the process would begin during the next reporting period.

One Member requested that Local Members be notified of the applications submitted within their ward, to which officers agreed.

Members took the opportunity to thank the Licensing Team for their continuous hard work and it was **RESOLVED:-**

- a) To note the contents of the report in respect of the Licensing Act

- b) To note the contents of the report in respect of the **Gambling Act 2005**.

1. PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

The purpose of the report is to update Members on relevant issues, with regard to

- the Licensing Act 2003
- the Gambling Act 2005

2. **RECOMMENDATION**

3. BACKGROUND

Members will be aware that a quarterly meeting is convened to review and discuss the implementation and progress of the Licensing Act 2003, together with any ancillary matters arising from responsibilities with which this particular Committee is charged.

Such ancillary matters include the Gambling Act 2005. (There may also be ancillary matters arising from the impact of the Smoke-Free Premises Regulations, which have the potential to affect all licensed premises).

4. LICENSING ACT 2003

4.1 Application Process

Applications received since the last update (19th April, 2021 to 20th June, 2021) are as follows:-

The number of TENs have risen dramatically since the last reporting period, jumping from 10 in last report to 74 during this period. This was predicted during the last report, the reason being the re-opening of pubs and clubs. TENs have predominantly been used to allow premises to utilise their space to increase their capacity due to limitations under the coronavirus regulations. The largest number have been used by clubs, because clubs are not permitted to allow 'offsales' unless they are open for 'on-sales', therefore when premises were only permitted to open outdoors clubs required a TEN to allow them to trade.

Applications as a whole have also steadily increased, jumping up from a total of 99 last report to 163 during this period. Again this is a reflection of the licensed trade opening back up. The majority have been transfer applications.

Personal licence applications remain consistent as does vary DPS applications. During the lockdown period for pubs and clubs many personnel moved trade which required backfilling, hence the changes of DPS and new personal licence holders.

A summary of TEN's, is reproduced for Members information as **Appendix 1A.**

In accordance with the advice received in respect of data protection matters, the summaries of Personal Licences and Premises Licences issued under delegated authority are now reproduced for information as a Part II restricted item.

4.3 Premises Inspection & Infringements

The relevant Performance indicator for the Licensing Team is "the premises licences found to be broadly compliant following inspection by Licensing Officers". Officers will consider confidence in management, compliance with licence conditions and business competency when determining the risk rating of the premises when considering whether they are broadly compliant.

Specific licensing inspections have not been conducted during this reporting period due to officers conducting coronavirus inspections.

Therefore there is no change to the current performance level for inspected premises which as reported last was 90.5%.

4.4 Complaints, Advice and Guidance

The current reporting period has seen all licensed pubs, clubs and restaurants re-open following their enforced closures due to the restrictions imposed by Welsh Government to combat the coronavirus pandemic. Initially the premises were only permitted to open outdoors but are also now allowed to trade indoors.

The licensing team have continued to be extremely active in conducting covid compliance visits in partnership with the RCT covid enforcement team and South Wales Police. This has been a key objective of the overarching Public Health Department within RCT. Advice has been provided on a daily basis, with the majority of premises trying hard to implement the necessary measures. Information sent to all licensed on sale premises regarding visiting officers, outside structures, TEN's in club premises and a reminder list to assist with reopening.

However complaints have been received relating to premises not adhering to the guidelines such as lack of, social distancing, track and trace details, table service etc. Many complaints have involved noise nuisance emanating from outside areas, this has been across the whole of RCT.

Much confusion and frustration from the trade has surrounded the issue of playing pub games such as pool, darts, skittles etc.

Where premises have not followed advice officers have issued Premises Improvement Notices (PINs) which gave the premises time to rectify any wrongs. Where breaches were so significant officers were permitted to issue a Closure Notice. One premises in Llantwit Fadre was closed for such breaches.

Whilst much officer time has been spent dealing with compliance of the Covid regulations, licensing matters have also continued.

Officers have been active in Pubwatch meetings which have now resumed in most areas of RCT. They have sat and chaired pre-application meetings and attended a club in Hirwaun for a meeting with committee to discuss a full variation application.

Issued 2 separate Section 19's for a premises in Aberaman breaching licensing conditions, namely lack of working CCTV.

Enforced the cessation of alcohol sales in a Penrhiwceiber premises for an absent DPS

A store in a Porth was also ordered to stop selling alcohol and had it removed from the shop front during a joint visit by a an RCT licensing officer and SWP licensing officer when they discovered an absent DPS. During the visit the owner was obstructive and uncooperative to officers. Information was relayed to SWP, which resulted in a follow up visit to the premises which identified a huge cannabis factory located upstairs. There were 18 bags of cannabis sent for destruction and one Albanian male was arrested. It's now clear that the closure of the shop front clearly made it much more difficult to hide. The licensing officer was thanked by SWP for their involvement.

Issues of underage drinking noted in Aberdare Town Centre, Cwmbach and Mountain Ash. Working with partners such as Police, Trading Standards and Youth Engagement Project (YEP) officers visited some off licenses in those areas to discuss acceptable forms of ID and the issue of proxy sales. Officers will be kept informed if any further information becomes known.

Pontypridd and Aberdare town centre forums have restarted – this involves joint working between RCT staff and South Wales Police to make town centres safer. Also the Public Space Protection Order (PSPO) is to be renewal in September, officers have attended meetings regarding this.

There have been Safety Advisory Group (SAG) meetings for potential events across the Borough – TEN's have started coming in for these with more due in for events in July and August – these are already going through SAG for advice.

The processing of the many applications has also taken much officer time.

The recovery of fees are as anticipated. At present officers have had to prioritise other workloads such as applications therefore they have not been focusing on chasing outstanding payments.
