5 Dolenni Ymgynghori

Penderfynodd yr Aelodau gydnabod yr wybodaeth oedd wedi'i darparu trwy'r dolenni ymgynghori mewn perthynas ag ymgynghoriadau agored, ymgynghoriadau Llywodraeth Cymru a'r materion hynny y mae'r awdurdod lleol yn cynnal ymgynghoriadau ynglŷn â nhw.

Dywedodd y Cyfarwyddwr Gwasanaeth, Gwasanaethau Democrataidd, fod Comisiwn y Gyfraith yng Nghymru a Lloegr wedi lansio ymgynghoriad ar drefn ddiogelwch tipiau glo newydd arfaethedig yng Nghymru a fyddai'n disodli deddfau sydd wedi dyddio ac yn gwella sut mae ystod o risgiau o ran tipiau glo yn cael eu rheoli. Y bwriad oedd y byddai'r Pwyllgor Trosolwg a Chraffu yn cael cyfle i ymateb i'r ymgynghoriad cyn ei ddyddiad cau ym mis Medi 2021.

6 Astudiaeth o Gludiant Coridor Gogledd-orllewin Caerdydd

Amlinellodd y Cyfarwyddwr Gwasanaeth Gwasanaethau Democrataidd yr adroddiad a'r bwriad i'r Pwyllgor Trosolwg a Chraffu roi sylwadau arno ac adborth i'r Cabinet mewn perthynas ag Astudiaeth o Gludiant Coridor Gogleddorllewin Caerdydd. Cadarnhawyd bod adroddiadau union yr un fath yn cael eu trafod gan Cyngor Dinas Caerdydd.

Awgrymodd y Cyfarwyddwr Gwasanaeth y dylai'r Gweithgor Craffu sy'n trafod datblygu isadeiledd trafnidiaeth ar gyfer y dyfodol er mwyn ymateb i gynllun Metro De Cymru, o ganlyniad i Rybudd o Gynnig yn y Cyngor Llawn, ailafael yn ei waith a chwrdd eto ar 7 Gorffennaf 2021. Bwriad hyn yw trafod yr ymatebion a gafwyd gan bartneriaid yn ogystal â'r wybodaeth yn yr adroddiad i'r Cabinet, a derbyn diweddariad am isadeiledd trafnidiaeth ar gyfer y dyfodol.

Cyflwynodd y Cyfarwyddwr Gwasanaeth, Gwasanaethau'r Rheng Flaen, ei adroddiad ac esboniodd, oherwydd twf sylweddol a nodwyd ar hyd y coridor sy'n cysylltu Tonysguboriau, Llantrisant a Gogledd-orllewin Caerdydd, o ran datblygiadau preswyl a gweithgaredd economaidd sydd wedi cael ei amlygu gan Gynlluniau Datblygu Lleol priodol Caerdydd. a RhCT, nodwyd coridor Gogledd-orllewin Caerdydd fel un o'r 4 coridor uchaf a dyfarnwyd cyllid iddo yn 2020/21 i symud ymlaen at gam cyntaf y broses WelTAG (Achos Amlinellol Strategol (SOC)). Canlyniad y Cam WelTAG 1 yw rhestr fer o atebion posib ar gyfer y coridor. Mae'n goridor sylweddol sydd heb opsiynau trafnidiaeth gyhoeddus go iawn ar hyn o bryd.

Dywedodd y Cyfarwyddwr Gwasanaeth fod gwaith sylweddol eisoes yn mynd rhagddo megis gweithio gyda Tradnidiaeth Cymru ar y Metro i ddarparu 12 trên yr awr i Bontypridd, 4 trên yr awr i Gwm Rhondda a Chwm Cynon, a fydd o fudd i'r cymunedau hynny ar hyd y llwybr i Gaerdydd. Gwaith ar orsafoedd newydd yn Ystâd Trefforest, Glan-bad a'r potensial ar gyfer Gogledd Pontypridd. Ymestyn rhwydweithiau rheilffyrdd, Aberdâr tuag at Hirwaun a chomisiynu astudiaeth yn edrych ar estyniad o Dreherbert i Dynewydd. Coridor y Cymoedd Canol o Borthcawl (gyda chyswllt trafnidiaeth gyhoeddus yn rhedeg ar hyd coridor yr A473 tuag at Drefforest ac yna ymlaen o Bontypridd i Abercynon, a chysylltiad rheilffordd newydd posib tuag at Treharris a Nelson, gan ddefnyddio'r llinell

fwynau i Ystrad Mynach gyda chysylltiadau trafnidiaeth gyhoeddus pellach i'r dwyrain tuag at y Coed Duon, Pont-y-pŵl a Brynbuga, o bosibl.

Mae Hwb y Porth yn parhau i gael ei ddatblygu ac ystyriaethau Parcio a Theithio o amgylch Pont-y-clun, Porth, Treorci, Trecynon a Hirwaun hefyd yn cael eu trafod. Mae'r prosiect tocynnau integredig hefyd yn cael ei ystyried.

I gloi, esboniodd y Cyfarwyddwr Gwasanaeth fod yr adroddiad yn cael ei gyflwyno o dan fframwaith WelTAG a nodwyd rhestr fer o opsiynau sy'n haeddu datblygiad ac asesiad pellach yng Ngham 2 WelTAG.

Trafododd y Pwyllgor Trosolwg a Chraffu yr adroddiad a nodi'r opsiynau trafnidiaeth gyhoeddus tymor byr a thymor hir sy'n cynnig yr achosion busnes gorau

er mwyn gwella mynediad o RhCT trwy Ogledd-orllewin Caerdydd i gyfeiriad canol y ddinas.

Nodon nhw'r ymholiadau canlynol-

Roedd yr aelodau'n awyddus i nodi sut y byddai'r opsiynau yn yr adroddiad yn cysylltu ag adolygiad CDLI RhCT o ran diogelu'r llwybrau a'r safleoedd a ddyrannwyd eisoes yn y CDLI cyfredol i gefnogi cyflwyno'r gwaith a sicrhau cyllid yn y dyfodol.

Gwnaeth yr aelodau sylwadau a gofyn am sicrwydd o ran y canlynol:

- Bod y cynigion yn yr adroddiad yn gynigion realistig a gellid eu cyflawni o fewn amserlenni 2020-2030 (Nodwyd na fyddai rhai o'r prosiectau'n cael eu gweithredu tan ddiwedd y degawd hwn)
- Byddai'r cynigion yn dod â buddion economaidd i RhCT nad oedd yn amlwg ar yr olwg gyntaf.
- Bydd dull gwell a chydgysylltiedig o deithio ac amserlenni bysiau a rheilffyrdd i ddarparu ar gyfer cymudwyr sy'n teithio yn hwyrach gyda'r nos
- Bod modd parhau i drydaneiddio Prif Linell De Cymru, na dderbyniodd arian gan Lywodraeth San Steffan

Nododd yr Aelodau fod y buddion economaidd uniongyrchol yn cynnwys cyfleoedd cyflogaeth a hyfforddiant a phrofiad teithio cyhoeddus cydgysylltiedig rhwng Tonysguboriau, Ystad Ddiwydiannol Llantrisant a'r ardaloedd cyfagos, a fydd o gymorth sylweddol i'r cymunedau hyn.

Gwnaeth y Pwyllgor sylwadau am nifer y datblygiadau tai mawr yn Ne'r Fwrdeistref Sirol, sydd wedi creu eu traffig eu hunain ac sy'n tyfu, a gofynnodd am sicrwydd bod asesiadau effaith y Cyngor ei hun yn ddigon cadarn i lywio'r gwaith o wneud penderfyniadau. Roedd y Pwyllgor yn falch o glywed y byddai dylanwadu a dyrannu safleoedd yn agos at gyfnewidfeydd cludo yn ffordd ymlaen, ac y byddai gwaith ochr yn ochr â Strategaeth y Cyngor i fynd i'r afael â Newid yn yr Hinsawdd yn datblygu dull i newid symudiadau teithio cyfredo yn sylweddol. Ar hyn o bryd mae 80% o'r cymudwyr yn teithio mewn car.

Gan gyfeirio at gynllunio ar ôl Covid, rhagweld, patrymau symud preswylwyr a'r effaith ar adeiladau swyddfa lle nad yw gweithwyr ond yn teithio i mewn i Gaerdydd ddeuddydd yr wythnos, roedd yr Aelodau'n teimlo nad oedd llawer o

dystiolaeth yn yr adroddiad bod hyn wedi'i ystyried.

Nodwyd bod siwrneiau bws i Gaerdydd yn haws o ganlyniad i isadeiledd da, ac mae preswylwyr yn defnyddio eu tocynnau bws. Roedd yr Aelodau'n falch y bydd isadeiledd tebyg yn ymestyn i rannau eraill o RhCT ond gofynnon nhw sut, yn y cyfamser, mae modd gwneud gwelliannau i'r gwasanaethau Bysiau Cludo Cyflym (Rapid Transit) rhwng ardaloedd fel Gilfach-goch a Chaerdydd?

Cyfeiriodd y Cyfarwyddwr Gwasanaeth at ddarparu lonydd bysiau â blaenoriaeth ar hyd y coridorau i ddarparu amseroedd teithio cyflymach a mwy cyson a chydnabu y gallai hyn roi defnyddwyr ceir dan anfantais, ac felly y gellir eu hannog i ddefnyddio'r bws.

Trafododd y Pwyllgor fanteision cerbydau trydan yr oeddent yn eu hystyried yn fwy cynaliadwy a derbyniol, a phwysigrwydd cael isadeiledd i gefnogi'r dull megis pwyntiau gwefru yn agos at orsafoedd trên. Fe wnaethant hefyd nodi'r newyddion diweddar am ddatblygiad cerbydau hydrogen. Atgoffwyd yr aelodau bod y Gweithgor Trosolwg a Chraffu wedi cynnal adolygiad i ddatblygiad isadeiledd i gefnogi perchnogaeth cerbydau carbon isel.

Siaradodd y Pwyllgor am bwysigrwydd ymgynghori â'r preswylwyr ar y cynigion, fel eu bod yn teimlo eu bod yn cael eu cynnwys. Dywedodd y Cyfarwyddwr Gwasanaeth y byddai unrhyw ymgynghoriad yn eang ac yn cynnwys preswylwyr a busnesau Caerdydd yn ogystal â'r rhai yn RhCT trwy lwyfan ymgysylltu ar-lein newydd a chyfryngau cymdeithasol, yn debyg i'r ymgynghoriadau diweddar ar faterion Newid yn yr Hinsawdd a Theithio Llesol. Pwysleisiodd hefyd fod y cynigion yn rhai tymor hir, a byddai nifer o gynlluniau yn dod gerbron y Pwyllgor Trosolwg a Chraffu yn ôl yr angen.

7 Ymgynghori ar y Strategaeth Newid Hinsawdd (2021-2025)

Cyflwynodd y Cyfarwyddwr Gwasanaeth, Gwasanaethau Democrataidd ei adroddiad. gan roi cyfle i'r Pwyllgor Trosolwg a Chraffu gyflawni gwaith cyngraffu ar yr adroddiad ar yr Ymatebion i'r Ymgynghoriad ar y Strategaeth Newid Hinsawdd Ddrafft (2021-2025).

Dywedodd y Rheolwr Polisi ac Materion Ymgynghori Cortfforaethol fod y Strategaeth Newid yn yr Hinsawdd wedi'i alw yn "Dewch i Siarad am Newid yn yr Hinsawdd RhCT",

a chafodd yr ymgyrch ei chynnal drwy borth ar-lein lle roedd modd rhannu straeon, sgyrsiau, holiaduron byr a fideos. Roedd y garfan Cyfryngau Cymdeithasol wedi cysylltu'r

ymgynghoriad ag ymgyrchoedd allweddol fel 'Diwrnod y Ddaear' i ennyn mwy o ddiddordeb a

trafodaeth ymhlith y preswylwyr, busnesau, ysgolion a'r

Grwpiau i Bobl Hŷn a oedd wedi ymgysylltu. Y gobaith oedd y byddai ymgynghori wyneb yn wyneb yn bosibl yn yr haf.

Croesawodd yr aelodau'r Strategaeth Newid yn yr Hinsawdd ddrafft (2021-2025), gan ddweud bod angen mawr amdani a'i bod wedi cychwyn trafodaeth gadarnhaol ymhlith preswylwyr a

busnesau RhCT. Fe wnaethon nhw nodi'r awydd i fentrau gwyrdd gael eu cynnal nifer o grwpiau cymunedol ledled y fwrdeistref sirol ond pwysleision nhw hefyd bwysigrwydd cydgysylltu'r gwaith da yn lleol er mwyn osgoi 'dull ar wasgar'.

Cododd un Aelod bryder ynghylch y cwestiynau yn yr ymgynghoriad a oedd yn rhy arweiniol yn eu barn nhw, ac yn annog yr ymatebion cadarnhaol yn unig. Teimlai'r Aelod y gellid gwneud mwy i ymgysylltu â phreswylwyr a busnesau, gan ofyn cwestiynau anoddach a mwy heriol am yr anfanteision a gosod blaenoriaethau.

Roedd un Aelod yn siomedig mai dim ond 56% o'r ymatebwyr a oedd o'r farn y byddai'r Ymrwymiadau Hinsawdd yn helpu'r Cyngor i gyflawni ei dargedau o ran gostyngiadau carbon.

Cyfeiriodd y Prif Weithredwr at y nifer fawr o gamau yn y Strategaeth ddrafft, fel cefnogi landlordiaid i wneud eu heiddo yn 'wyrdd', fel gweithredoedd tymor hir a fydd yn cael eu gweithredu dros y 15-20 mlynedd nesaf. Pwysleisiodd fod llawer o'r gweithredoedd, waeth pa mor fach ydynt, yn cyfrannu at y strategaeth gyffredinol ac mai un rhan hollbwysig o gyflawni targedau oedd ymgysylltu â phreswylwyr cymaint â phosibl.

Gwnaeth yr aelodau sylwadau a gofyn am sicrwydd bod y sgyrsiau parhaus a'r strategaeth ddrafft yn ystyried:

- Cefnogaeth i blannu coed a fyddai'n helpu i liniaru llifogydd;
- Grwpiau cymunedol yn prynu coetir ac yn datblygu prosiectau gerddi trefol;
- Mabwysiadu safonau gofynnol cenedlaethol ar gyfer contractwyr a chyflenwyr i'w hannog i gefnogi'r cyngor i ddod yn garbon niwtral;
- Cynlluniau hydro;
- Isadeiledd priodol i gefnogi a hwyluso gwefru cerbydau trydan gartref ac i ymchwilio i ffyrdd o wireddu gwefru ar y stryd, sut i wneud hyn yn ymarferol;
- Trafodaethau cynnar gyda datblygwyr i osod cyfleusterau cerbydau trydan ym mhob adeilad newydd

Wrth ymateb i'r ymholiadau a godwyd, dywedodd y Prif Weithredwr fod strategaeth yn cael ei datblygu i sicrhau aildyfiant naturiol coetir sy'n rhoi'r 'goeden iawn yn y lle iawn' yn fwy na phlannu, a gall hyn osgoi cyflwyno afiechyd. Mae prosiectau adfer mawnog hefyd ar y gweill fel ffordd o liniaru amledd storm uwch a glawiad a allai fod yn uwch trwy storio mwy o ddŵr yn yr ucheldiroedd. Gall adfer y nifer o fawnod diraddiedig hefyd gynyddu atafaelu carbon yn RhCT.

Roedd yr aelodau'n awyddus i gymeradwyo y bydd tai newydd yn garbon sero ond yn cydnabod nifer yr eiddo a chartrefi hŷn sydd ledled y sir a fyddai'n elwa o gynlluniau ôl-osod i'w hatal rhag 'gollwng egni';

1. PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

- 1.1 To provide members of the Overview & Scrutiny Committee with the opportunity to consider the proposals within the Law Commission's consultation on Regulating Coal Tip Safety in Wales through discussions with representatives from the Law Commission of England and Wales at its meeting.
- 1.2 This report proposes a mechanism for members of the Overview & Scrutiny Committee to provide their responses to the consultation on a proposed new coal tip safety regime in Wales that would replace outdated laws and improve how a range of risks with coal tips are managed

2. RECOMMENDATIONS

It is recommended that Members: -

- 2.1 Acknowledge the presentation from the Law Commission representatives in respect of its proposals contained within the consultation which was launched on the 9th June 2021; and
- 2.2 Consider, where appropriate, any comments committee may wish to make to the consultation before its closure on the 10th September 2021.

3. REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATIONS

- 3.1. As the overarching scrutiny committee, the Council's Overview & Scrutiny Committee has responsibility for undertaking scrutiny of matters which impact upon the whole council.
- 3.2 It is important that Scrutiny has the opportunity to respond to the consultation by the 10th September 2021 so that its response will contribute to the final

recommendations for the Welsh Government and subsequently to the final report of the Law Commission in early 2022.

4. BACKGROUND

- 4.1 Across the whole of Wales there are approximately 2,000 disused coal tips which present a number of risks such as instability and coal tip slides, flooding, pollution which can have a detrimental impact on the surrounding environment and spontaneous combustion.
- 4.2 In Rhondda Cynon Taf, disused tips are regulated by the Mines and Quarries (Tips) Act 1969. Some tips are owned by Rhondda Cynon Taf Council (formerly under the ownership of Mid Glamorgan County Council) while some are privately-owned, and others are under the control of the Coal Authority or Natural Resources Wales. Tips in Rhondda Cynon Taf Council are categorised on a risk-based approach from A to D, with D being the highest risk.
 - 4.3 Following the Storms in February 2020, a number of landslides occurred across Wales including Tylortsown Tip making the national news where over 30,000 cubic metres of the hillside slid into the river valley. In order to improve the outdated laws and manage the range of risks associated with coal tips, the Law Commission of England and Wales has launched a consultation on a proposed new coal tip safety regime in Wales.
- 4.4 Amongst the proposals is the establishment of a 'supervisory authority' with responsibility for the safety of all disused coal tips. The proposed functions for the authority include:
 - o 'Compiling and maintaining a register of all disused tips in Wales
 - Arranging for inspections of tips and the creation of tip management plans
 - As required, designating tips as high risk (in relation to tip slides and/or other risks) which would bring into play an enhanced safety regime with increased involvement of the supervisory authority to minimize dangerous hazards occurring.
- 4.5 The proposals look to improve how coal tips are regulated and maintained under a new regulatory framework which would promote consistency across the country and more importantly avoid risk and danger through an enhanced safety regime. The regime would develop a coal tips register, compiled and maintained by the supervisory authority and ensure regular inspections of coal tips.

5. CONSULTATION / INVOLVEMENT

5.1 As the Council's overarching scrutiny committee it is appropriate that the Overview & Scrutiny Committee contributes to the discussions and consultation which will respond to the proposals as set out in the following links:

(A copy of the Cabinet Work Programme is attached for information at Appendix 2).

4. BACKGROUND

- 4.1 As Members will recall, the Scrutiny Work Programmes have a reduced number of meetings for this Municipal Year to allow for the work to be timetabled with the best use of resources available. This will allow for a more flexible approach to recognise the needs of emerging priorities and provides opportunity for Scrutiny Working Groups to be taken forward and training provision where requested.
- 4.2 The work programme should reflect the committee's aims and objectives as well as add value to the work of the Council. It is up to the Committee to agree the items for inclusion in its work programme, but ideas are brought together from a number of sources to assist members in their choices. It is important that all Members have the opportunity to put forward items for consideration.

ongoing such as the opportunity to undertake scrutiny of the Section 19 statutory reports on conclusion of the investigations that the Council has undertaken into the February Floods as the Lead Local Flood Authority (LLFA) under the Flood and Water Management Act 2010 and the modernisation of the council's residential care home service for older people.

- 4.5 Other principles which have been taken into account:
 - The work programme represents a mixed selection of topics;
 - ➤ It meets deadlines in relation to other Council meetings and those of external partners;
 - Consideration as to whether the topic duplicates review activity which is taking place elsewhere; and
 - Flexibiltiy- to ensure that new topics can be factored in and changes accounted for.

5. **CABINET WORK PROGRAMME**

5.1 Attached at Appendix 2 is the Cabinet Work Programme for 2021/22 and Committee is asked to consider if there are any topics that can undergo prescrutiny by this Committee.
