Minutes of the meeting of the Licensing Act 2003 held on Tuesday, 1 February 2022 at 4.30 pm.

37 Declaration of Interest

In accordance with the Council's Code of Conduct, there were no declarations made pertaining to the agenda.

It was **RESOLVED** to note that when Members determine the licensing and registration matters before them, they have a duty not to act in a manner that is incompatible with the convention on Human Rights and the Crime and Disorder Act.

39 Minutes

It was **RESOLVED** to approve the minutes of the 2nd November 2021. as an accurate reflection of the meeting.

40 Review of the Licensing Act 2003 & Gambling Act 2005

The Head of Service for Public Protection and Regulatory Services provided the Committee with the report on relevant issues with regard to the Licensing Act 2003 and the Gambling Act 2005, together with ancillary

matters arising from the responsibilities charged to the Committee.

It was reported that the number of TENs applications received have fallen from 81 in the last report to a total of 58 during this period which can be attributed in part to the coronavirus restrictions that were introduced from Boxing Day such as nightclubs being forced to close, groups of no more than six people could meet in licensed premises, table service only and the two-metre social-distancing rule returned.

Furthermore, an analysis of the TEN's applications indicate 30 for existing premises licences, 14 for permitted community events and 14 from Private Members Clubs, which included some of the autumn rugby internationals for which some of the TENS were issued for this period, and also the festive period saw TENS for activities such as Christmas markets, carol concerts and the sale of alcohol in non-licensed premises.

The Head of Service for Public Protection and Regulatory Services reported that since the last Committee report, there had been one contested application for a Grant of Premises License which had been granted subject to the addition of conditions and two reviews for the period, one of which was requested by South Wales Police for the Cwm & Llantwit Welfare Hall, Beddau, whereby the Sub-Committee determined to revoke the license and there is an Appeal pending; and the second was requested by RCT Trading Standards for Pontypridd Anna, Pontypridd, whereby the Sub-Committee determined to revoke the license.

Furthermore, it was reported that in the last report whereby it was revealed that there was a dispute over the timeline of the appeal from the applicant of the Players Bar which had been lodged and was listed for preliminary legal arguments to determine if the appeal was submitted out of time, the outcome of this was that the Court upheld the decision that the Appeal was lodged out of time and the revocation of licence took effect. Also, an Appeal from the Applicant of the Cwm & Llantwit Welfare Hall had been lodged and reported as pending.

The Head of Service for Public Protection and Regulatory Services referred Members to section 4.3 of the report, where the premises inspections and infringements were outlined. Members learned that the inspections undertaken have primarily been conducted following complaints, with those premises being deemed to be higher risk due to alleged non-compliance issues, which is shown in the slight decrease since last reported in the current performance level for inspected premises which is now at 90.42%.

It was report that in relation to the number of complaints received this had been quieter than usual due to the restrictions imposed by covid regulations, whereby many licensed premises reporting issues with staff and needed to close over the Christmas and New Year period due to isolating staff. Furthermore, premises are also struggling to get SIA supervisors pre pandemic they were costing £10 an hour and now the cost has increased to around £18.50 per hour, which is tough for the trade to get SIA staff as so many have not renewed their registration or found work elsewhere.

Members learned that Pubwatch activities continue to proceed in the Taf area, also, the Treforest Pubwatch has been expanded to include Rhydyfelin, Treforest Ind Est and Hawthorn areas in the hope of getting a higher attendance, whereby letters have been sent out to licensed premises with dates planned for the rest of the year. Furthermore, the Pontypridd Pubwatch held an extra meeting to enable the Covid Enforcement Team attend to explain the new rules to those present and everyone was afforded the opportunity to ask questions, which was a great benefit to the licence holders.

The Head of Service for Public Protection and Regulatory Services noted that the licensing Manager and Senior Licensing Officer attended the Institute of Licensing Annual Conference, which was an opportunity to attend a large number of events regarding the whole of the licensing regime, to gain knowledge on current and upcoming issues and refresh knowledge in other fields.

The Head of Service for Public Protection and Regulatory Services outlined that during last committee members were informed that since January 2021 there have been 20 reports relating to spiking in the RCT area, however, there were no confirmed cases of spiking, partly due to the nature of the reporting as it is generally retrospective. Furthermore, concerns were expressed over a potential increase in spiking over the Christmas period, however, after consulting with South Wales Police, it was advised that there had been no reported incidents over the festive period, although whilst this is good news, we must be mindful of the increased Covid restrictions that were put in place for the hospitality sector that may have had an impact.

Members learned that on Tuesday 21 December 2021, the Wales Safer Communities Network, with support from the Wales Violence Prevention Unit, hosted a Spiking Workshop to discuss the approaches being taken to tackle and reduce the risk of 'spiking' in Wales with public bodies, third sector organisations and private companies. Furthermore, the workshop which was the first of a number of workshops and discussions on the topic, gave an opportunity to share information from across Wales and ensure that there are no gaps being left between the different agencies and partnerships, ensuring there is a coordinated and joined up response.

It was reported that the Local Government Association has also met and following discussion with partner agencies have stated so far there has been very little, if any, evidence that there is an issue of spiking, however, the licensing authority has supported the Wales wide Christmas campaign and Police anti spiking campaign by posting information of the social media site. The Head of Service for Public Protection and Regulatory Services reported that in relation to the Ask Angela Campaign, this initiative is being co-ordinated by Community Safety, Licensing and Domestic Violence staff and was relaunched week commencing 15th November 2021 to coincide with Safeguarding week. Furthermore, the Local Authority have printed and distributed 'Ask Angela' literature to all the licensed premises within RCT, which the lead officer is following this up by attending targeted licensed premises, providing face to face awareness. Also, within the first couple weeks of the campaign, a female presented herself to staff at a premises within the Pontypridd area and asked for Angela, whereby the staff member ensured her safety and arranged for her to get home in a safe manner.

In terms of the recovery of annual fees, Members were reminded that the Licensing department had initially taken the decision to not chase immediate payment of the fees during the past year due to the economic hardship placed on premises but had to begin chasing payments due to Legislation requirements. It was noted that the total income received as at 31st December 2021 was £104,301, which was attributed to the hard work of the team.

Members noted that there were no significant changes in terms of the Gambling Act 2005. Members were advised that the local RCT statement of principles was put before the committee in September has been accepted at Full Council and is now live and valid.

Members took the opportunity to thank the Licensing Team for their continuous hard work and it was **RESOLVED:-**

1. <u>PURPOSE OF THE REPORT</u>

The purpose of the report is to update Members on relevant issues, with regard to

- the Gambling Act 2005

3. BACKGROUND

Members will be aware that a quarterly meeting is convened to review and discuss the implementation and progress of the Licensing Act 2003, together with any ancillary matters arising from responsibilities with which this particular Committee is charged.

Such ancillary matters include the Gambling Act 2005. (There may also be ancillary matters arising from the impact of the Smoke-Free Premises Regulations, which have the potential to affect all licensed premises).



4. LICENSING ACT 2003

4.1 Application Process

Since we saw the removal of the coronavirus restrictions, the number of TENs applications have steadily increased and have now more than doubled the total since the last report.

In the community, there has been the return of sporting events, fund raising and fetes which all utilise the TENs process. June brought an influx of TENs applications for the Queen's Jubilee celebrations and currently TENs are bring submitted for Pride events which are due to take place in July.

The Royal Mint Visitor Experience have used a number of Tens to facilitate monthly artisan market stalls held in their carpark.

An analysis of the TEN's applications indicate, 51 for existing premises licences, 51 for permitted community events and 24 from Private Members Clubs.

A summary of TEN's, are reproduced for Members information as **Appendix 1A**.

You will also note from the table that there is a large change of DPS within premises. This is partly due to larger organisations changing personnel within their premises and the continuing trend that people are looking for alternative work due to pubs/clubs etc still feeling the effects of the pandemic.

However, the 37 new personal licence holders show that this may be a positive step for the industry in the future.

4.3 **Premises Inspection & Infringements**

The relevant Performance indicator for the Licensing Team is "*the premises licences found to be broadly compliant following inspection by Licensing Officers*". Officers will consider confidence in management, compliance with licence conditions and business competency when determining the risk rating of the premises when considering whether they are broadly compliant.

Officers have stepped up their efforts to conduct inspections during this reporting period. In total there has been 97 premises inspected throughout the Borough, a number of which have required follow up visits. These visits have primarily targeted premises that are previously non-compliant, or related to complaints.

Very few inspections were conducted during the pandemic and it was anticipated that the inspections show premises may not now be fully compliant with conditions of their licence. This has proven to be correct with many premises being determined broadly non-compliant, reasons range from minor indiscretions to major concerns such as CCTV not working and absent DP's.

This is shown in the slight decrease since last reported in the current performance level for inspected premises which is now at **89.7%**.

Officers are working continuously with these premises to ensure they become compliant.



4.4 Complaints,

Advice, Guidance & Information

- The alcohol industry has continued to feel the impact of the Covid pandemic, with premises not receiving the same footfall as pre-pandemic. Some have remained closed. Moving forward it is hopeful that some form of normality will resume to allow the trade to be sustainable. This is highlighted by a licensee placing his pub for sale (Rhondda Hotel) as it is not a viable business because of Covid. A new person has made enquiries about transferring the licence. Advice and guidance has been provided.
- The above is also the same for the Security Industry Authority (SIA) where it is estimated there are 40,000 less SIA registered individuals in the UK than prepandemic, which in turn impacts on the premises that require such staffing.
- Ongoing problematic complaints have continued since the previous report. These have been tricky to investigate thoroughly as officers have had to continue to work within the confines of Covid concerns. Noise complaints etc have been unable to be monitored properly due to people feeling nervous about having officers in their homes. This is wholly understandable, but provides barriers to officers when trying to assist the public to accurately assess the issues.
- The 'Ask Angela' campaign (as raised in previous reports) is working and has been utilised in Pontypridd town centre – this has been used and people have been taken care of by our licensed premises. As mentioned in previous reports, this is a very positive campaign to assist any person who feels threatened while out in the pub/club scene. Management of premises are now aware of this and train their staff to be aware of this. Any time this is utilised is a success and reassures the member of the public that staff within premises are there to assist. Whilst businesses are there to succeed and make profit it shows that public safety is considered. This is down to good work from officers within various departments and agencies promoting such topics.
- As mentioned within the last report theTreforest pubwatch has been extended to include the Rhydyfelin and Hawthorn areas. This has proved successful of late as this was a failing pubwatch group. By extending to these areas it seems to have injected a bit of life back in, which is great news as the Pubwatch scheme is a great way of allowing licence holders and DPS opportunity to raise concerns to the licensing department and the police about local and national issues, and to also interact with each other.
- Training has been provided to committee members from James Button who is recognised as a leading expert in the field of licensing. Hopefully the training gave an insight into the requirements and expectations of both members and licensing officials.
- The Licensing Authority sit on the event Safety Advisory Group ESAG, this group of members discuss and meet with potential event organisers to ascertain what Council functions they require to ensure any event is run safely and legally. This is a multi-discipline group with members from the Local Authority including Licensing, Environmental Health, Parks, Events and Highways, and external

agencies such Wales Fire amongst



as South Wales Police, South Service, Ambulance Service others. During the past two years

many events have been cancelled or postponed, meaning this year especially with the Jubilee weekend – the ESAG have been particularly busy!! In the run up to the Jubilee weekend in June, the group met fortnightly, and realistically spoke on an almost daily basis to ensure the events organised throughout RCT were run safely. This is a time consuming exercise but an essential one to allow RCT to hold events of all scales successfully and more importantly safely.

 Treorchy High street was awarded the champion high street of Great Britain in January 2020. The Lion Pub located on the street is a hub of this community and on 5th July a Royal visit is arranged to mark this achievement. This has been delayed since 2020 due to Covid. HRH Prince Charles will be attending the Lion where he will also meet with other businesses at the pub.

The Lion pub has been very pro active over the past few years and continues to do so. They have held an outdoor green grocers in their front beer garden which was highly successful, this has led to the opening of Green Valley – zero waste shop and greengrocers. The premises has also positioned a red phone box in the garden and turned it into a mini library with shelves full of books for people's use and displays art work from local school children. This shows that licenced premises can be very positive in the local community when managed responsibly.

- Other events within the Borough include Tyson Fury coming to Rhondda Fach Sports Centre on 15th July and 3 separate events held in Pontypridd Park (9th July), Gelligaled Park (16th July) and Aberdare Park (23rd July) to celebrate key workers and present 'Freedom of the Borough' to some. The events will provide fun activities for children and include choirs and brass bands.
- Within the Rhondda there is also the Treorchy Music Festival on 30th July in which licensed premises taking part. There is a Treorchy Food & Drink Festival on 27th August, and Pride events taking place on 16th July at Flamingo Bar.
- The Ivor Hael pub in Llwynypia is running a scheme cost of ingredients meal deal. Within the next month to 6 weeks they will be selling food at cost price. Persons buying meals must get a voucher from a food bank, they can then exchange with the pub for cost price meals. The premises has been working with Cllr Wendy Lewis and others to sort out the logistics. This is another positive action from a licensed premises looking to assist the community.
- Mid Rhondda pub watch and Porth pub watch have re-started following the pandemic. Upper Rhondda pub watch will be starting soon. This again shows encouraging signs for the willingness to move forward and work together in partnerships.
- Complaints, queries and guidance have continued during this reporting period. These include (but are far from exhaustive):-
 - Cwmparc Legion problems with an absent DPS which led to the pub having to close for a short time, this has now been resolved and a new DPS is in place.

- Pentre outside of action has

as well as alcohol being taken of sales. No further action is now deemed necessary

- pre-opening advice meeting at pub in Abercwmboi. The premises had been closed for several years and is being refurbished, ready to reopen in the next few weeks. Premises known as Cap Coch Inn.
- An officer visited a store in Aberaman (Blaengwawr Stores) following reports that the DPS had died. The DPS was also PLH and had died 3 weeks before prior so without prompt intervention the premises licence would have lapsed (28 day limit for transfer after death).
- Joint meeting with an Environmental Health Officer at club in Taffs Well (Taffs Well Ex-Servicemens) to discuss noise and ASB issues at an 18th birthday party. Club have agreed not to hold any more 18th birthday parties.
- Visit made to a premises in Cwmbach (Cwmbach Legion) following reports that the premises was trading whilst suspended for non-payment of annual fees. Two years annual fees were promptly paid allowing the premises to reopen.
- Pre application advice given to new venture in Mountain Ash (Mountain Ash Town Hall)
- Joint enforcement visit with Police & Home Office Immigration officers to a store in Mountain Ash following underage sales at the premises. Evidence gained during this visit prompted a premises review.
- The Ship Inn in Llantwit Fadre has been subject to complaints over a prolonged period of time. This has been a time consuming exercise. These complaints are now being assessed by the Environmental Pollution team.
- There are ongoing concerns with door staff at a premises within Pontypridd. This issue is being discussed with police colleagues.
- Noise complaints from Lanelay Hall in Talbot Green.
- Underage drinking in the Bush, Clydach Vale
- Treorchy RFC, a number of issues that has required a meeting between the premises, police and licensing.
- Spar, Pontyclun, major concerns regarding the running of the business and potential absent DPS.
- This reporting period has also seen a number of reviews of licences within the Borough, in excess of what is normally witnessed. These have taken much time and effort from officers to process. The fact that Reviews have been necessary shows the work that officers carry out and where required take necessary action. These reviews have been applied for by South Wales Police, the Licensing Authority and Environmental Health, this shows there are wide ranging concerns such as noise nuisance, breaches of conditions, underage sales and illegal employment of foreign nationals. The responsible authorities work closely to assist premises but when these efforts are not met satisfactory then officers will take the relevant action to promote the licensing objectives.
- It is very pleasing to have recognition for the work done, and therefore it is extremely pleasing that as part of a partnership approach to Covid Enforcement Maria Meek and Bethan Walters have been awarded with a

Special Constable and South Wales



Recognition Award from the Chief Police Crime Commissioner for Police. This is well deserved. The

officers worked tirelessly during the pandemic in partnership with the police to give advice and to enforce legislation. This was not always welcomed by some premises but it was conducted to ensure the public remained safe.

• The licensing team regularly receive complaints from members of the public via councillors, which is good and expected. However given there are new councillors on the committee, the licensing department wish to advise that it is in the best interest of the constituent to contact the department directly and provide specific details of the complaint and how it affects them personally and to provide contact details. Officers need to follow up complaints, without the full information and the avenue to contact the individual it is difficult to make full enquiries. It is recommended the public email Licensing.section@rctcbc.gov.uk

4.5 Spiking

This subject has remained prominent within media and has been monitored by the local authority through regular meetings with South Wales Police. There appears to be no issues within the RCT Borough of spiking which is very positive.

Awareness is being raised throughout the industry and within South Wales Police and the Licensing department.

The senior licensing officer attended a two hour course in relation to Anti Spiking Awareness, the course was provided by SOS or 'Stamp Out Spiking'. The invitation was provided from the Pontypridd BID as part of a pubwatch initiative in Pontypridd – this highlights the partnership work that goes on behind the scenes within the licensing arena.

The session lasted two hours and covered topics such as:

- How to spot a victim of spiking
- What to do if a customer alerts you they think they've been spiked
- The time limits for testing a person this is shockingly short!
- Staff training measures in relation to drink spiking for both front of house and SIA doorstaff
- Incident reports and who to report to
- The importance of CCTV and bodycam footage in such an event

There were approximately 20 people in attendance and they were mainly Premises Licence Holders, Designated Premises Supervisors and managers from licensed premises in the town centre. The course facilitator SOS offered to come to other pubwatch groups across RCT, they also offer an online training module for staff which most licensees were interested in. This was such a positive course about such a negative subject and everyone seemed to leave with a much better understanding of what to do if this was to occur in one of our licensed premises.
