Cyflwynodd Pennaeth Gwasanaeth Diogelu'r Cyhoedd a Gwasanaethau Rheoleiddio yr adroddiad i'r Pwyllgor. Roedd yr adroddiad yn trafod materion perthnasol o ran Deddf Trwyddedu 2003 a Deddf Gamblo 2005 ar gyfer y cyfnod rhwng 14 Hydref 2022 ac 15 Ionawr 2023, yn ogystal â materion atodol eraill sy'n deillio o gyfrifoldebau'r Pwyllgor.

Wrth ddadansoddi ceisiadau am Hysbysiad Digwyddiad Dros Dro, roedd 68 oddi wrth safleoedd trwyddedig a oedd yn bodoli eisoes, 22 ar gyfer achlysuron cymunedol â chaniatâd a 9 oddi wrth oddi wrth glybiau aelodau preifat, a daeth llu o geisiadau i law ym mis Tachwedd i ymestyn oriau agor mewn safleoedd trwyddedig a chlybiau ar gyfer Cwpan Pêldroed y Byd. Parhaodd hyn tan gyfnod y Nadolig lle'r oedd cynnydd yn nifer yr Hysbysiadau Digwyddiad Dros Dro ar gyfer gweithgareddau megis marchnadoedd y Nadolig, cyngherddau carolau a gwerthu alcohol mewn safleoedd heb drwydded, ynghyd ag ymestyn oriau ar gyfer y sector manwerthu a safleoedd trwyddedig eraill i fasnachu dros yr ŵyl. Mae 24 o drwyddedau personol newydd wedi'u dyrannu.

Rhoddodd Pennaeth Gwasanaeth Diogelu'r Cyhoedd a Gwasanaethau Rheoleiddiol wybod bod un cais wedi'i wrthwynebu ers adroddiad diwethaf y Pwyllgor, a hynny ar gyfer amrywio trwydded safle. Cafodd ei gymeradwyo, ond yn dilyn diwygiadau i'r cais amrywio gwreiddiol.

Ymhellach i hyn, does dim adolygiadau wedi bod yn ystod y cyfnod yma. Serch hynny, mae dau apêl gan ymgeiswyr yn Food For You, Pontypridd, lle gwrthodwyd yr apêl gan y Barnwr ac felly roedd penderfyniad y Pwyllgor yma i ddirymu trwydded y safle dal yn berthnasol. Yn Mountain Ash Stores, T/A Central Food, Aberpennar, cafodd penderfyniad y Pwyllgor yma i ddirymu trwydded y safle ei gwtogi gan y Barnwr, a benderfynodd atal y drwydded dros dro am 3 mis. Daeth hyn i rym am hanner nos ar 30/11/22 tan hanner nos ar 27/02/23. Yn ogystal â hyn, roedd yr Hen Swyddfa Bost ('Squares'), Porth wedi cyflwyno apêl, sydd yn yr arfaeth ar hyn o bryd.

Cafodd yr Aelodau eu cyfeirio at adran 4.3 yr adroddiad, lle caiff arolygiadau o safleoedd a thor rheolau eu hamlinellu. Arolygwyd cyfanswm o 47 o safleoedd ledled y fwrdeistref sirol. Roedd angen ymweliadau dilynol ar rai ohonyn nhw oherwydd pryderon ynghylch cydymffurfio â manylion eu trwyddedau.

Clywodd yr Aelodau fod y gwaith rhagweithiol sy'n cael ei gynnal wedi arwain at ychydig o ostyngiad yn y lefel cyflawniad presennol ar gyfer safleoedd a arolygwyd. Mae bellach yn 90.38% o'i chymharu â 90.66% yn ystod y cyfnod adrodd blaenorol.

Rhoddodd Pennaeth Gwasanaeth Diogelu'r Cyhoedd a Gwasanaethau

Rheoleiddio wybod bod Swyddogion yn cydweithio'n barhaus â'r safleoedd yma i sicrhau eu bod yn cydymffurfio. Rhoddodd wybod hefyd eu bod nhw wedi ymweld â Mountain Ash Stores ar ddau achlysur gwahanol i brynu alcohol er mwyn gwirio bod y safle'n cydymffurfio â'i orchymyn atal dros dro. At hynny, ar y ddau achlysur doedd dim alcohol yn cael ei arddangos, a phan ofynnwyd i aelod o staff am alcohol, gwrthododd ei werthu i'r Swyddogion. Roedd y safle'n cydymffurfio â'u gorchymyn atal dros dro o 3 mis.

Cafodd yr Aelodau wybod bod dau Swyddog Trwyddedu wedi mynychu'r gynhadledd hyfforddiant genedlaethol yn Stratford-upon-Avon ym mis Tachwedd 2022, ynghyd â Chadeirydd y Pwyllgor Trwyddedu, y Cynghorydd Fox. Mae lleoedd yn brin ar y cwrs, sef un o achlysuron blynyddol pwysig maes trwyddedu, ac roedd y Cyngor yn ddigon ffodus i gael lle am ddim i un Swyddog. At hynny, bydd y Swyddog yn rhoi cyflwyniad i aelodau eraill grŵp Sefydliad Trwyddedu Cymru ar 8 Chwefror i rannu ei brofiad o'r achlysur. Cytunodd y tri a fynychodd ei bod yn gynhadledd gynhwysfawr ac roedd digonedd o sesiynau llawn gwybodaeth.

Rhoddodd Pennaeth Gwasanaeth Diogelu'r Cyhoedd a Gwasanaethau Rheoleiddio wybod i'r Aelodau fod erthygl wedi ymddangos yn y wasg yn ymwneud ag eiddo yn y Porth a oedd yn destun camau gorfodi gan Heddlu De Cymru a arweiniodd at ddod o hyd i ffatri ganabis. Er bod hyn wedi bod yn bryder i'r Awdurdod Trwyddedu, dylid nodi nad yw'r eiddo wedi masnachu ers sawl mis, a bod trwydded y safle bellach wedi'i hildio.

Clywodd yr Aelodau fod ardal y Tymbl yng Nghanol Tref Pontypridd yn edrych ychydig yn wahanol ar hyn o bryd gyda dim ond pedwar o'r chwe safle trwyddedig yn masnachu. Dydy'r hen safle 'Players' ar Broadway ddim wedi ail-agor eto, er gwaethaf iddo gael trwydded newydd. Hefyd, dydy 'Soul Suite' ddim wedi ail-agor ers mis Mawrth 2020 ac mae'n parhau i fod yn wag. Mae trwydded y safle yn dal i fod yn ddilys.

Hefyd, daeth i sylw y Cyngor bod siop gyfleustra fechan ddim yn cydymffurfio achos doedd dim goruchwyliwr dynodedig yno. Ymwelodd Swyddogion Trwyddedu â'r siop a daeth yr holl werthu alcohol i ben. Cafwyd cais trosglwyddo ac amrywio goruchwyliwr dynodedig y safle gan y perchnogion newydd cyn pen 3 diwrnod i'r ymweliad, gan olygu bod y safle yn cydymffurfio unwaith yn rhagor.

At hynny, mae safle hwyr y nos yng nghanol tref Aberdâr wedi agor am y tro cyntaf ers y pandemig. Mae bellach ar gau eto ar gyfer mis Ionawr gan eu bod nhw'n disgwyl iddi fod yn dawel o ran busnes.

Cafodd yr Aelodau wybod bod Martin Roberts o raglen deledu 'Homes Under The Hammer' wedi prynu'r dafarn ym Mlaen-cwm ac mae'r drwydded bellach yn cael ei throsglwyddo i enw ei gwmni.

Hefyd, cafodd yr Aelodau wybod bod rhywfaint o gamau gorfodi wedi cael

eu dwyn yn erbyn siop 'vape' yn Aberdâr dros y misoedd diwethaf, gan ddod i sylw Swyddogion Safonau Masnach yn benodol. Er nad oedd y siop dan sylw yn safle trwyddedig, roedd yn denu pobl ifainc a phlant o'r ysgol, gan achosi pryder i'r safleoedd trwyddedig yn yr ardal. Llwyddodd Safonau Masnach i gael Hysbysiad Cau gan y Llys ac mae'r safle bellach ar gau. Does dim hawl iddo ail-agor am 3 mis.

Nododd Pennaeth Gwasanaeth Diogelu'r Cyhoedd a Gwasanaethau Rheoleiddio bod cynllun Pubwatch yn parhau i fod yn llwyddiant yn y fwrdeistref sirol, gyda chyfarfodydd rheolaidd yn parhau i gael eu cynnal ledled Rhondda Cynon Taf. Mae Swyddogion Trwyddedu yn cynnig cymorth ac arweiniad yn y cyfarfodydd a chaiff safleoedd eu hannog i fynychu.

Yn ogystal â hyn, cynhaliodd y grŵp Cynghori ar Ddiogelwch, sy'n blatfform aml-asiantaeth, gyfarfod yn gynnar ym mis Ionawr i drafod yr achlysuron sydd i ddod am y flwyddyn. Mae llawer o drefnwyr wedi cysylltu â'r grŵp i sicrhau bod eu hachlysuron yn ein bwrdeistref sirol yn cael eu cynnal mewn modd ddiogel a chyfreithlon.

Cafodd yr Aelodau wybod bod 11 o gwynion ar wahân am sŵn mewn un safle trwyddedig yn Aberaman wedi dod i law Swyddogion Trwyddedu yn ystod mis Tachwedd 2022. O ganlyniad i hyn, cynhaliwyd ymarfer monitro ar y cyd â Swyddogion lechyd yr Amgylchedd ar 26 Tachwedd. Hefyd, roedd sŵn cerddoriaeth i'w chlywed y noson honno mewn eiddo preswyl cyfagos. Ymwelodd Swyddogion â'r safle ar yr un noson i roi cyngor. Cynhaliwyd cyfarfod ychydig ddyddiau wedyn gyda deiliad trwydded a goruchwyliwr dynodedig y safle. Penderfynodd rheolwyr y safle roi'r gorau i bob achlysur a oedd yn cynnwys DJ, yn ogystal â disgos i bobl ifainc. Ers hynny does dim cwynion pellach wedi dod i law.

Roedd yr Aelodau'n falch o glywed oddi wrth grŵp Pubwatch Trefforest lle, ym mis Ionawr, roedd un safle trwyddedig wedi croesawu menyw oedrannus ar ôl iddi fod mewn damwain â char yn y stryd. Cafodd hi ddishgled a rhywle cynnes i aros wrth i'r ambiwlans gyrraedd. Sylwodd safle trwyddedig arall yn yr ardal ar ddyn ar y stryd yn y tywydd oer. Aethon nhw ag ef i mewn, gan roi bwyd a diod poeth iddo. Mae deilydd y drwydded o'r farn bod y dyn yn byw yn yr ardal, ond roedd yn bryderus amdano y diwrnod hwnnw am fod y tywydd yn oer.

O ran adennill ffioedd blynyddol, cafodd yr Aelodau wybod bod talu ffioedd blynyddol yn parhau i fod ar y lefel ddisgwyliedig ar gyfer adeg yma'r flwyddyn. Serch hynny, mae deiliaid trwyddedau fel arfer yn gohirio talu tan ar ôl cyfnod y Nadolig. At hynny, mae saith safle wedi ildio eu trwyddedau yn ystod y cyfnod yma – pob un ohonyn nhw yn ardal Cwm Rhondda.

15 DECLARATION OF INTEREST

In accordance with the Council's Code of Conduct, there were no declarations made pertaining to the agenda.

16 HUMAN RIGHTS ACT 1998 AND CRIME AND DISORDER ACT

It was **RESOLVED** to note that when Members determine the licensing and registration matters before them, they have a duty not to act in a manner that is incompatible with the convention on Human Rights and the Crime and Disorder Act.

17 MINUTES

It was **RESOLVED** to approve the minutes of the 14th November 2022 as an accurate reflection of the meeting.

18 REVIEW OF THE LICENSING ACT 2003 & GAMBLING ACT 2005

The Head of Service for Public Protection and Regulatory Services provided the Committee with the report on relevant issues with regard to the Licensing Act 2003 and the Gambling Act 2005 for the period 17th October 2022 to 15th January 2023, together with ancillary matters arising from the responsibilities charged to the Committee.

An analysis of the TEN's applications indicate 68 for existing premises licences, 22 for permitted community events and 39 from Private Members Clubs and the month of November brought a flurry of applications to extend hours in licensed premises and Clubs for the Football World Cup. Furthermore, this led into the festive period which saw TENS increase in number to cover activities such as Christmas markets, carol concerts, and the sale of alcohol in non-licensed premises, along with the extension of hours for the retail sector and other licensed premises to trade over the holidays.

24 new personal licenses that have been allocated.

The Head of Service for Public Protection and Regulatory Services reported that since the last Committee report, there had been one contested application for a Variation of Premises Licence which had been Granted but following amendments to the original variation application.

Furthermore, no reviews have been determined during this period, however, there are two appeals from Applicants at Food For You, Pontypridd, whereby the Appeal was dismissed by the Judge and therefore the decision of the Licensing Act Committee to revoke the premises licence was upheld, and at Mountain Ash Stores, T/A Central Food, Mountain Ash, whereby the Judge reduced the Licensing Act Committee's decision to revoke the premises licence, to a 3-month suspension which took effect at midnight on 30/11/22 and runs until midnight on 27/02/23. Moreover, an Appeal had been lodged by the Old Post Office (Squares), Porth which is currently pending.

Members were referred to section 4.3 of the report, where the premises inspections and infringements were outlined. In total there has been 47 premises inspected throughout the Borough, some of whom have again required follow up visits due to concerns on adherence to their licence.

Members learned that the proactive work being conducted has shown a slight decrease in the current performance level for inspected premises which is now at 90.38% compared to 90.66% during the previous reporting period.

The Head of Service for Public Protection and Regulatory Services reported that Officers are working continuously with these premises to ensure they become compliant and that they visited Mountain Ash Stores on 2 separate occasions to conduct test purchases for alcohol and ensure that they were complying with their suspension. Furthermore, on both

occasions there was no alcohol on display and when asked, the member of staff refused any sale. They were complying with their 3-month suspension.

It was reported that two Licensing Officers attended the National Training Conference in Stratford Upon Avon in November 2022, along with the Chair of Licensing Committee Councillor Fox, where we were very fortunate to be awarded a free place for one Officer as conference is an important date in the Licensing annual calendar and places are limited. Furthermore, the Officer will now make a presentation to the other members of the Wales Institute of Licensing group on 8th February, to share the experience and all three who attended agreed it was a full conference with plenty of informative sessions.

The Head of Service for Public Protection and Regulatory Services advised that Members may have noticed an article in the press relating to a premises in Porth, whereby the premises was subject to enforcement action by South Wales Police resulting in a cannabis factory being discovered. While this has been a concern to the Licensing Authority it should be noted that the premises has not traded for several months, and the Premises Licence has now been surrendered.

Members learned that the Tumble area of Pontypridd Town Centre is currently looking a little different with just 4 of the 6 licensed premises trading and that the old Players premises on the Broadway has not reopened yet, despite being Granted a new Premises Licence. Also, the Soul Suite has not re-opened since March 2020 and remains empty, the Premises Licence is still valid.

Moreover, a small convenience store was found to be non-compliant as no DPS was employed at the premises, a visit was conducted by Licensing Officers and all alcohol sales were ceased. New owners of the premises applied for a Transfer and Vary DPS application within 3 days, rendering the premises once again compliant.

Furthermore, a late-night premises in Aberdare town centre has opened for the first time since the pandemic and this premises has now closed again for January due to an expectation of a quiet January.

It was also reported that we have a celebrity taking over a premises in Blaencwm, Martin Roberts from Homes under the Hammer TV programme has bought the pub and the licence is now transferred into his company's name.

Members were advised that a Vape shop in Aberdare has seen some enforcement action over the past few months, particularly coming to the attention of Trading Standards Officers. Although the shop involved was not a licensed premises, it was attracting youths and school children to the area causing concern to the licensed premises in the area. Furthermore, Trading Standards were successful in obtaining a Closure

Notice from the Courts and this premises has now been secured and is unable to re-open for a 3 month period.

The Head of Service for Public Protection and Regulatory Services highlighted that the Pubwatch remains strong within RCT, regular meetings continue to take place across the Borough, and Support and guidance are offered by Licensing Officers at these meetings and premises are encouraged to attend.

Additionally, the Safety Advisory group which is a multi-agency platform held a meeting in early January to discuss the events coming up for the year, many event organisers have been in contact with the group to ensure events in our Borough run safely and legally.

It was reported that Licensing Officers received eleven separate noise complaints about a single licensed premises in Aberaman during November 2022 which resulted in a joint monitoring exercise with Environmental Health Officers on 26th November. Also, Music noise was audible that evening in a nearby residential property and Officers visited the premises that same evening to offer advice and a meeting was held a few days afterwards with the Premises Licence Holder and DPS. Furthermore, the management of the premises took the decision to cease all DJ events and youth discos and since that time no further complaints have been received.

Members were pleased to her that two good news stories came from the Treforest Pubwatch group in January, whereby one licensed premises took an elderly lady in when she had been involved in an accident with a car in the street, they offered her tea and warmth while she waited for an ambulance to arrive. Another licensed premises in the area noticed a male on the street in the cold, took him in to their premises and gave him something warm to eat and a warm drink. The licence holder believes the male lives in the area but was concerned for him that day in the cold weather.

In terms of the recovery of annual fees, Members were advised that the payment of annual fees remains at an expected level for this time of the year, however, Licence holders typically delay payment until after Christmas period.

Moreover, 7 premises have surrendered their licence during this period, all of which are located in the Rhondda area.

3. BACKGROUND

Members will be aware that a quarterly meeting is convened to review and discuss the implementation and progress of the Licensing Act 2003, together with any ancillary matters arising from responsibilities with which this particular Committee is charged.

Such ancillary matters include the Gambling Act 2005. (There may also be ancillary matters arising from the impact of the Smoke-Free Premises Regulations, which have the potential to affect all licensed premises).

4. LICENSING ACT 2003

4.1 Application Process

Members will notice the number of TEN's submitted this period has reduced slightly following the Christmas and New Year period.

There appears to be a trend for TEN's to be submitted for the sale of alcohol at rugby games played in local clubs and also artisan or farmers markets selling alcohol as an off sale.

There are also a few TEN's submitted from the late-night alcohol premises as a result of the springtime change of hours, to allow them to open for the same number of hours as usual.

An analysis of the TEN's applications indicates, 21 for existing premises licences, 15 for permitted community events and 18 from Private Members Clubs.

A summary of TEN's is reproduced for Members information as **Appendix 1A.**

In accordance with the advice received in respect of data protection matters, the summaries of Personal Licences and Premises Licences issued under delegated authority are now reproduced for information as a Part II restricted item.

4.3 Premises Inspection & Infringements

The relevant Performance indicator for the Licensing Team is "the premises licences found to be broadly compliant following inspection by Licensing Officers". Officers will consider confidence in management, compliance with licence conditions and business competency when determining the risk rating of the premises when considering whether they are broadly compliant.

Officers are continuing to inspect premises and are putting much time into this. In total there has been 46 premises inspected throughout the Borough, some of whom have again required follow up visits due to concerns on adherence to their licence.

The proactive work being conducted has shown an increase in the current performance level for inspected premises which is now at 89.94% compared to 90.38% during the previous reporting period.

Officers are working continuously with these premises to ensure they become compliant.

4.4 Complaints, Advice, Guidance & Information

- Members may recall an issue outlined in a previous report, of a club in the Aberaman area causing a noise nuisance to residents which was alleviated by both Licensing and Environmental Health Officers after a monitoring exercise. Unfortunately, further complaints have been received, however, advice has been given to the club and since then there have been no further complaint.
- 2 licensed premises (1 in Cwmbach and 1 in Ynysybwl) have had a Section 19 Closure Notice issued following a breach of their CCTV condition. These Notices have been initially complied with and will stay in place until full compliance is achieved. Officer will reinspect to ensure compliance.
- A pub in Aberdare rang South Wales Police reporting assistance for 'ASK ANGELA'. They had witnessed a male attempt to kiss a female customer making her feel uncomfortable, South Wales Police attended and asked the man to leave, which he did. The female customer did not want to make a complaint. The Licensing Team are bringing this to the attention of members to show the Ask Angela scheme is being utilised across the Borough and is successful in making vulnerable people feel safer while in our licensed premises.
- A private members club in the Trallwn area of Pontypridd has previously had
 issues with noise and anti-social behaviour complaints emanating primarily
 from its smoking area. Licensing Officers have visited the premises to offer
 advice and guidance along with South Wales Police Licensing Officers and as
 such the premises have agreed to submit a Minor Variation application to
 include CCTV on the premises and smoking area.
- Complaints have been received through Pontypridd Pubwatch members that a
 licensed premises within Pontypridd town centre is staying open later than
 permitted. A joint visit was conducted by Local Authority and South Wales
 Police Officers where it was discovered that there was non-compliance with
 licence conditions. Further investigations are ongoing and will be updated in
 the next report.
- Advice has been given by Environmental Health Officers and Licensing
 Officers for events at a private members club in Pontyclun. They are currently
 considering options regarding changing to a Premises Licence to ensure
 compliance with the Licensing Act 2003 when offering these events.
- A joint visit from South Wales Police and Local Authority Licensing Officers was conducted following an assault in a licensed premises in Pontypridd which resulted in two Police Officers being assaulted outside the premises. Full advice and guidance have been offered to the Premises Licence Holder and DPS, with an action plan to be put in place to improve the conditions on the current Premises Licence. The premises were employing two SIA door staff on the night in question, the Premises Licence Holder has assured the Authorities they will not be returning to the premises in an employed capacity.

Ongoing investigations into a late-night licensed premises in the Porth area this premises has been the subject of a high number of noise complaints over
the last 3 years and joint working from Environmental Health Officers,
Licensing Officers, and South Wales Police. The appeal hearing is due to be
heard on 7th June 2023.

Pre application meetings

- A pre application meeting has been held in the Council Offices for a Premises Licence in the Post Office Pontypridd Town Centre, advice and guidance was given to the potential applicant in relation to Off Sales and the specific issues within the town centre such as the PSPO, the location of agencies and the day and night-time economies. The potential applicant has a number of licensed premises and was able to show the Authorities he had given due concern to the Licensing Objectives. An application has not been submitted to date.
- A pre application meeting has been held in relation to the Granting of a
 Premises Licence in Pontypridd town centre for an Italian pizzeria. The
 potential applicant offered some assurances to the Authorities and would be
 happy to work with them in the future. He indicated that the times applied for
 would be mainly for daytime and early evening with an alcohol permission for
 on sales only to protect the PSPO. An application is pending for this.

Good News Story

• The Wyndham Hotel in the Rhondda has been awarded Highly Commended for The Best Pub and Social Club 2023 in the Best of Welsh Business Awards. They are very proud of this achievement especially as they have only been open under new management for 18 months.

The payment of annual fees remains at an expected level for this time of the year. As mentioned in the previous report, licence holders typically delay payment until after Christmas period. Officers have been monitoring this and chasing payment which can be seen by the increase in payments received in January/February 2023. The authority has a very robust process to ensure payment is received and will take action such as suspension where necessary. Several premises have had their licence suspended during this period, which has triggered a reaction and payment from the premises resulting in the suspension being lifted. Officers have noted that there is an increase in time spent chasing fees for premise licence holders that have left the business, but not surrendered the licence and informed the team accordingly.
