1. PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

- 1.1 The purpose of the report is to provide a presentation to Members on the results and key points of the Your Voice Survey 2022-23

2. RECOMMENDATIONS

- 2.1 Scrutinise and comment on the information contained within this report.

3 REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATIONS

- 3.1 To give Members the opportunity to review and provide feedback on the Your Voice Survey 2022-23.

4. BACKGROUND

- 4.1 The Youth Service (YEPS – Youth Engagement and Participation Service) provide enriching opportunities and support services for young people across RCT to support young people aged 11-25 years to achieve their potential and overcome barriers to learning and progression.
- 4.2 The Youth Engagement and Participation Service (YEPS) provides the statutory Youth Service for Rhondda Cynon Taf County Borough Council. This service is provided by a workforce of qualified staff made up of school based workers, community based youth workers, specialist youth work teams and skilled qualified part time staff.

- 4.3 YEPS offers young people 11-25 access to a variety of FREE youth work activities across a range of settings including schools, colleges, community settings and youth clubs. Young people can get involved by seeing their YEPS worker in schools, colleges, or via the [website](#).
- 4.4 YEPS provide information, advice and guidance to young people on a one to one basis (referral work) and/or group sessions.

5. YOUR VOICE YOUTH SURVEY

- 5.1 The Your Voice youth survey is usually taken every 2 years, but due to the pandemic, there has been 4 years since the last survey in 2018. Children and young people aged between 11-25 completed the survey in schools, colleges, youth clubs and other community settings across the county borough, representing the diversity of young people living, being educated or working in RCT.
- 5.2 The Children and Young people were given the opportunity to complete a series of interactive questions on a range of thematic areas, which were decided following consultation with other Council services
- 5.3 The Survey directly informs the planning of services for both the Council and partners to ensure the key priorities of people, places and prosperity are achieved with young people's views contributing to driving these forward
- 5.4 Attached at Appendix 1 to this report is a presentation which summarises the results to the Survey which was completed by almost 5,000 Young People across the County Borough, and includes data and information on feedback received in a number of areas including Education, Training, Employment, Information Advice and Guidance, Community Safety and Wellbeing

- 11.2 Young people are a key cohort of our community as they are the next generation of Rhondda Cynon Taf. As such, they are a priority group under The Well Being of Future Generations (Wales) Act 2015. It is felt that this report, the survey findings and the subsequent developments that are occurring as a result, will contribute to all of the seven elements that the Act is aiming to achieve:

5. A Wales of cohesive communities;
6. A Wales of vibrant culture and Welsh language;
7. A globally responsible Wales

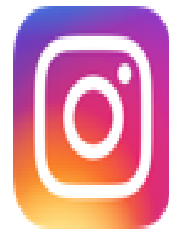

Key points

- The survey is usually taken every 2 years, but due to the pandemic, there has been 4 years since the last survey in 2018; the pandemic altered the mindsets and values of many people, including young people, thus these results are more important than ever in ensuring the Council is responsive to current needs
- Directly informs the planning of services for both the Council and partners to ensure the key priorities of people, places and prosperity are achieved with young people's views contributing to driving these forward

Key policies

- Supports our statutory duty to co-ordinate Youth Support Services as set out in the **Learning and Skills Act (2000)**
- Upholds the **United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC)**, e.g. Article 12 *states 'Every child has the right to say what they think in all matters affecting them, and to have their views taken seriously'*.
- **'Extending Entitlement: Support for 11-25 year olds in Wales'** outlines the right that every young person in Wales has. One of the ten entitlement is: *'The right to be consulted to participate in decision-making, and to be heard, on all matters which concern them or have an impact on their lives.'*
- **The Future Generation Act (2016)** states that Local Authorities have a responsibility to ensure information and materials aimed at children and young people are clear and easy to read, accessible and relevant. Local Authorities have the responsibility to promote the UNCRC and adopt the National Participation Standards.

YOUR VOICE SURVEY 2022-2023

Almost 5,000 young people, aged 11-25 completed the survey in schools, colleges, youth clubs and other community settings across the county borough, representing the diversity of young people living, being educated or working in RCT. 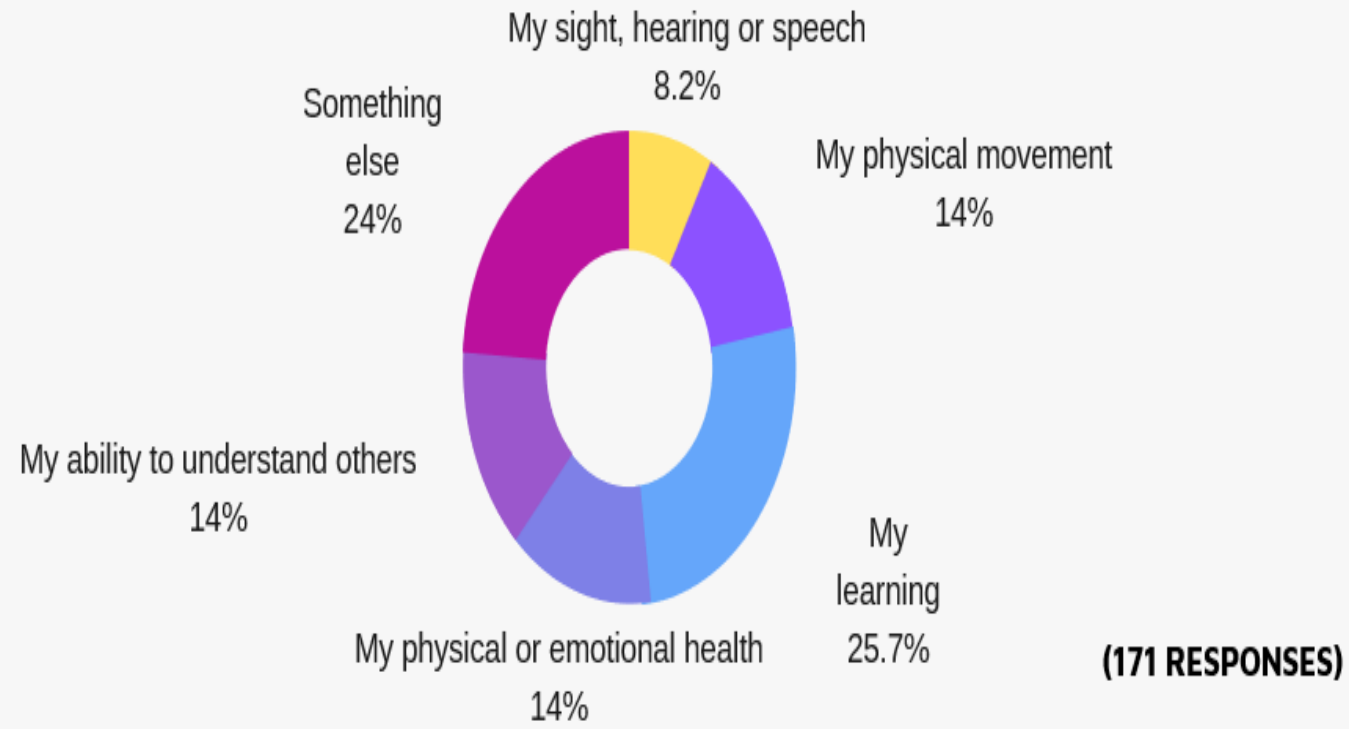

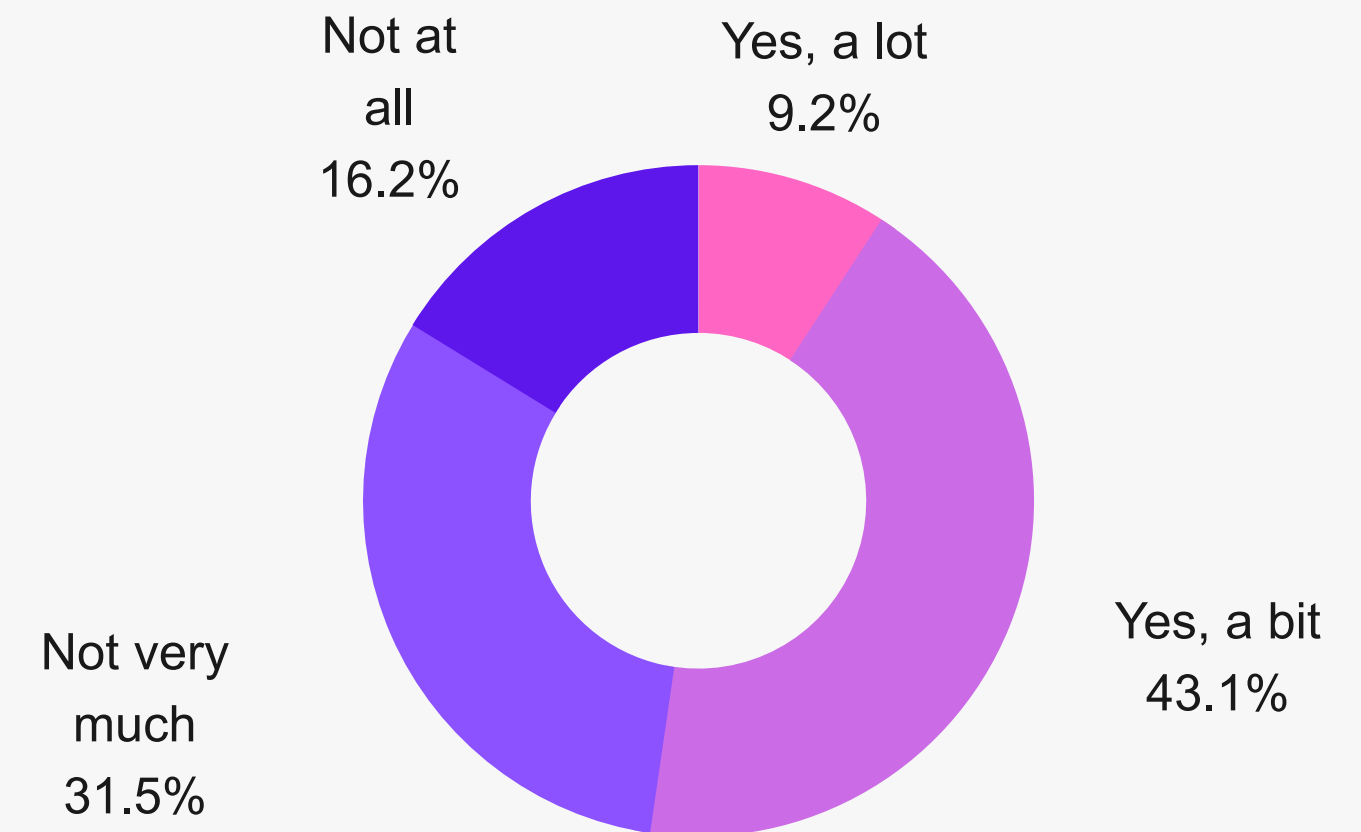

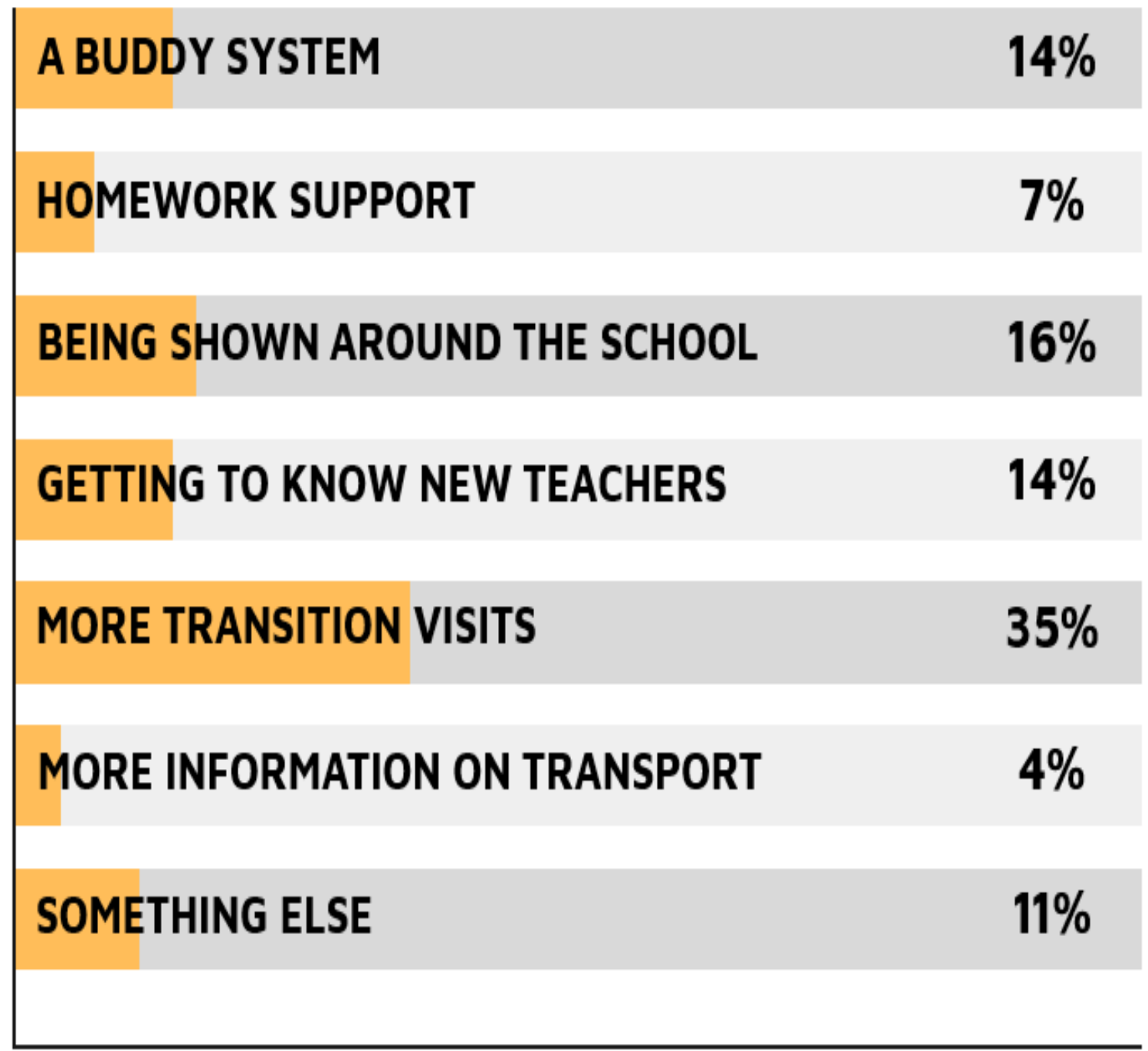

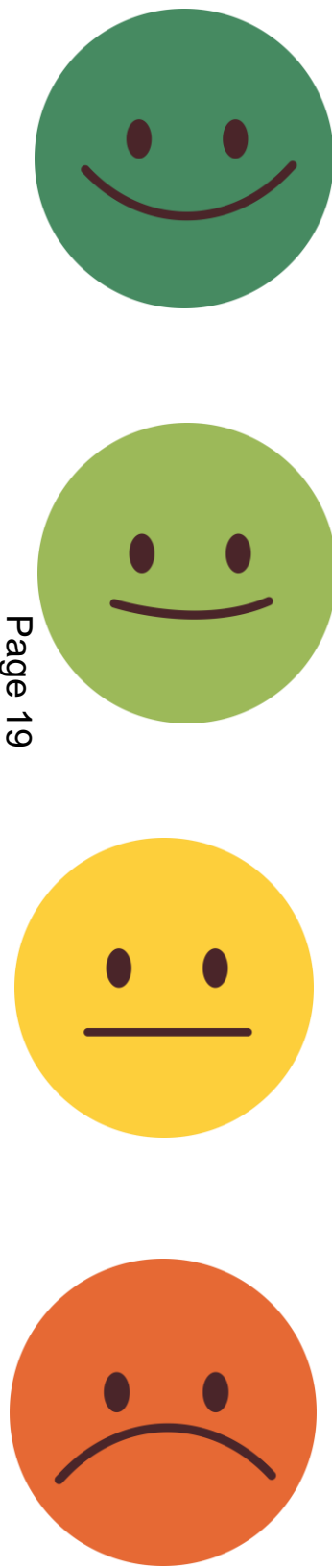

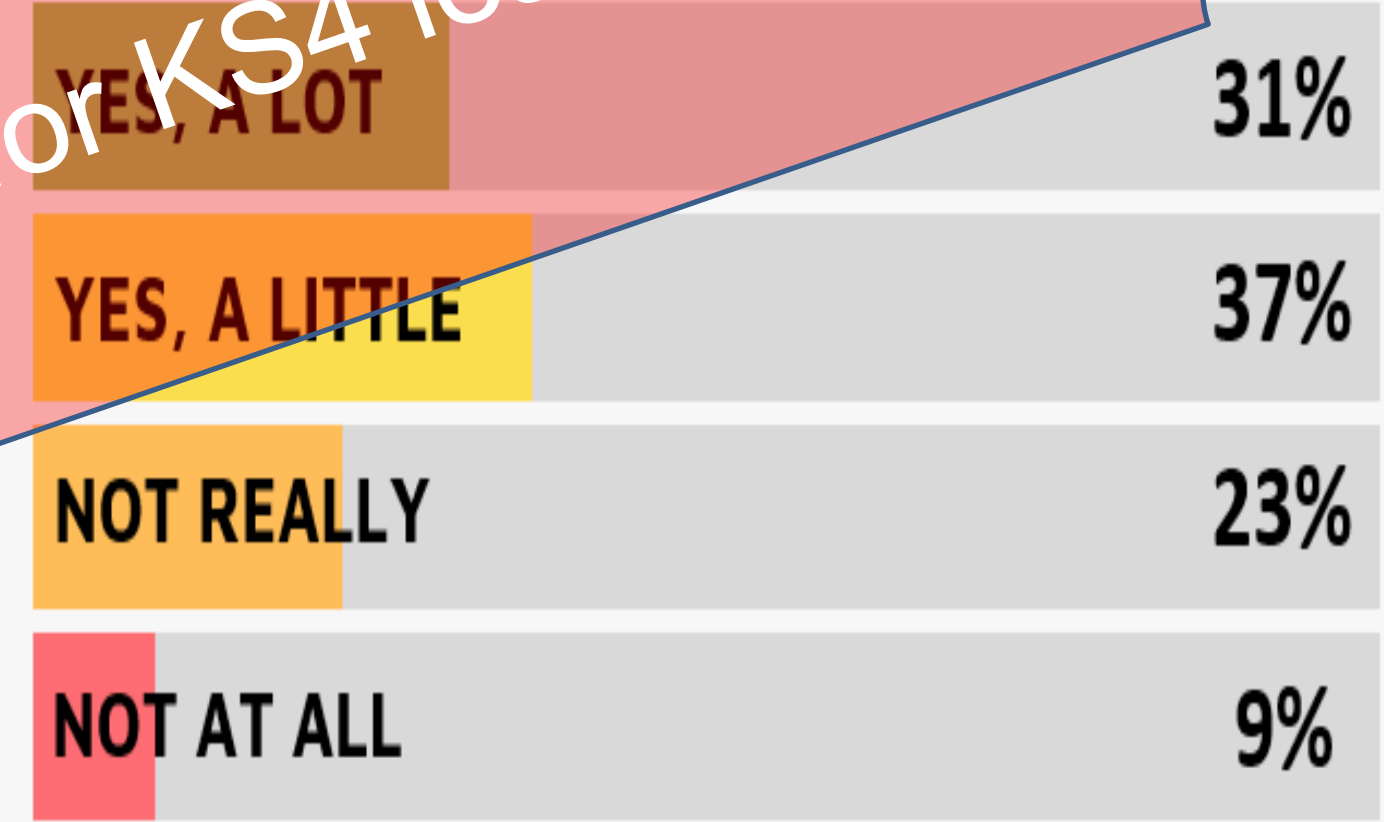

- Improve available information for KS4 learners regarding 16+ EET options

- ❑ From November 2023, YEPS' Transitional Support Workers (TSWs) will be piloting an earlier intervention programme for pre-16 learners (Year 10) who have been identified as at risk of becoming NEET
- ❑ The TSWs will be improving the promotion of available support for Year 11+ learners, including signposting to relevant partners
- ❑ YEPS' 16+ team are leading on a mapping exercise of all EET support and eligibility criteria available across RCT; this is being shared with the Youth Support Services sub-groups, which consists of both internal and external partners

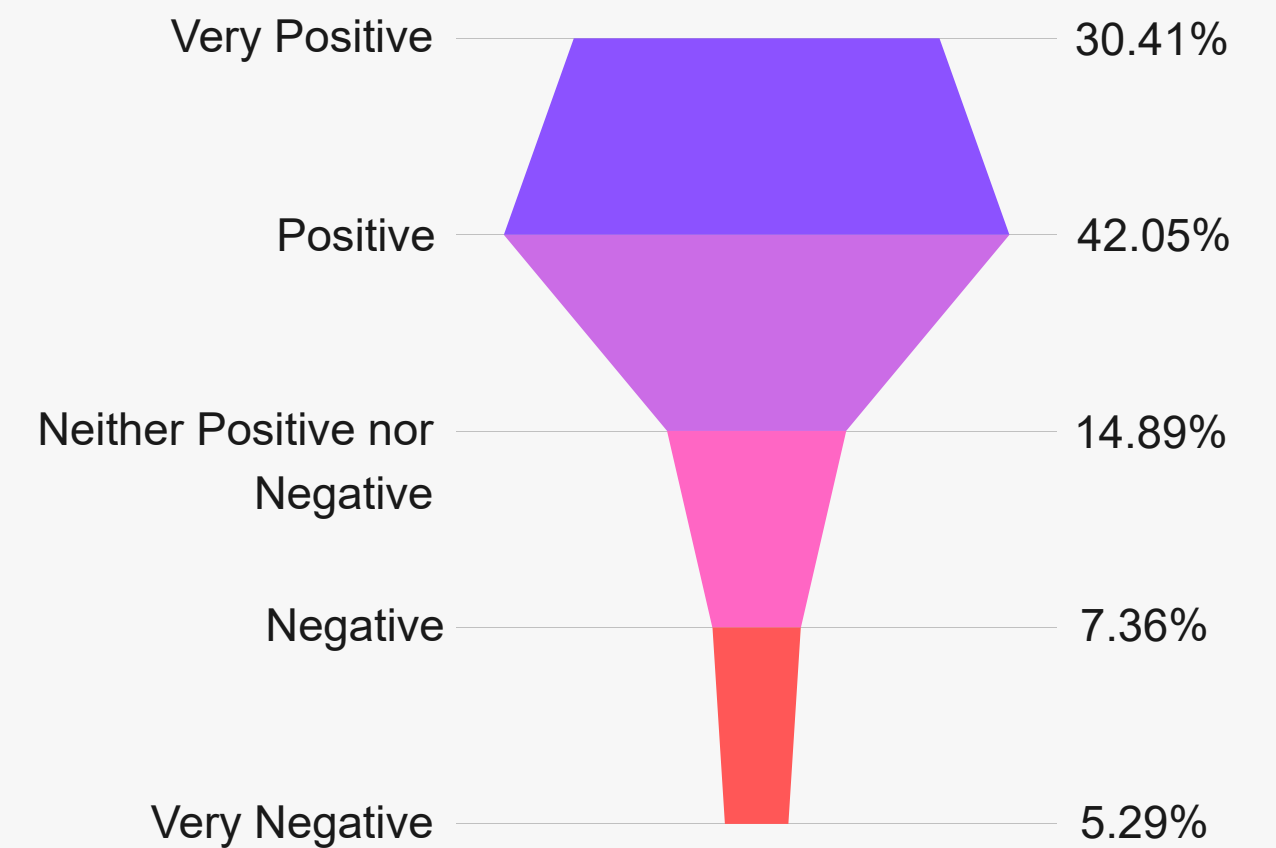

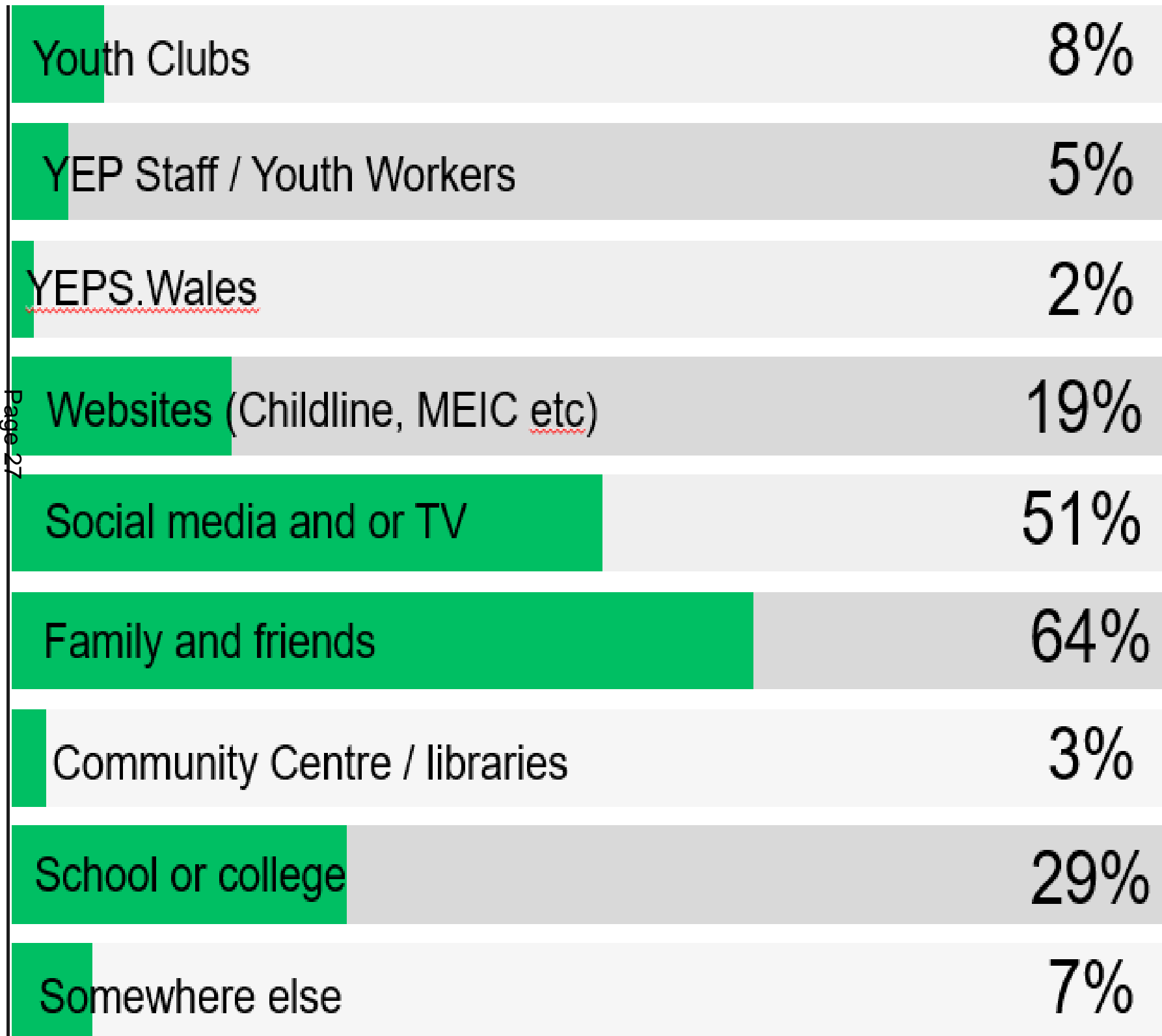

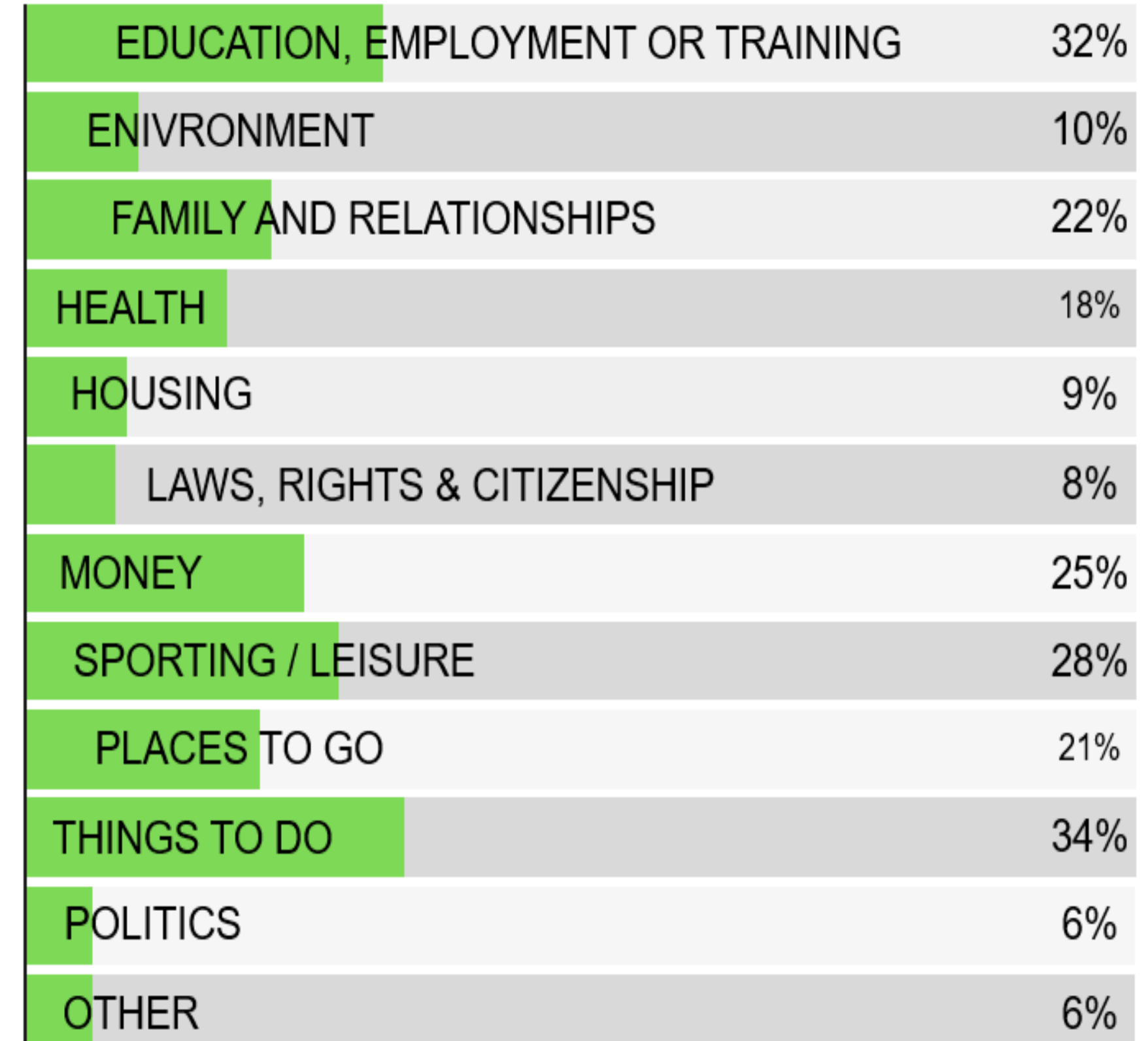
How do you currently find the information you want?

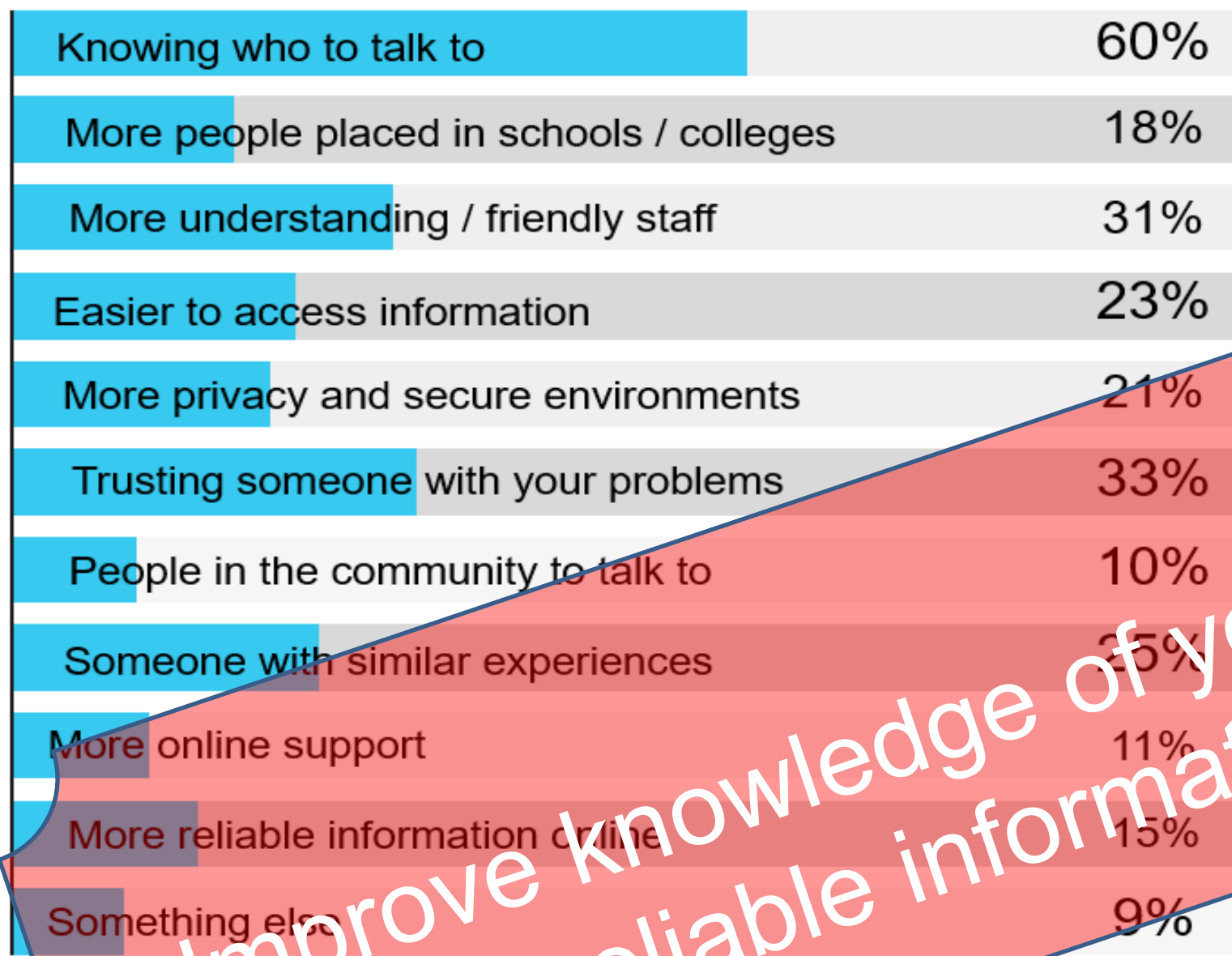
Where, who and how would you prefer to get this information from?



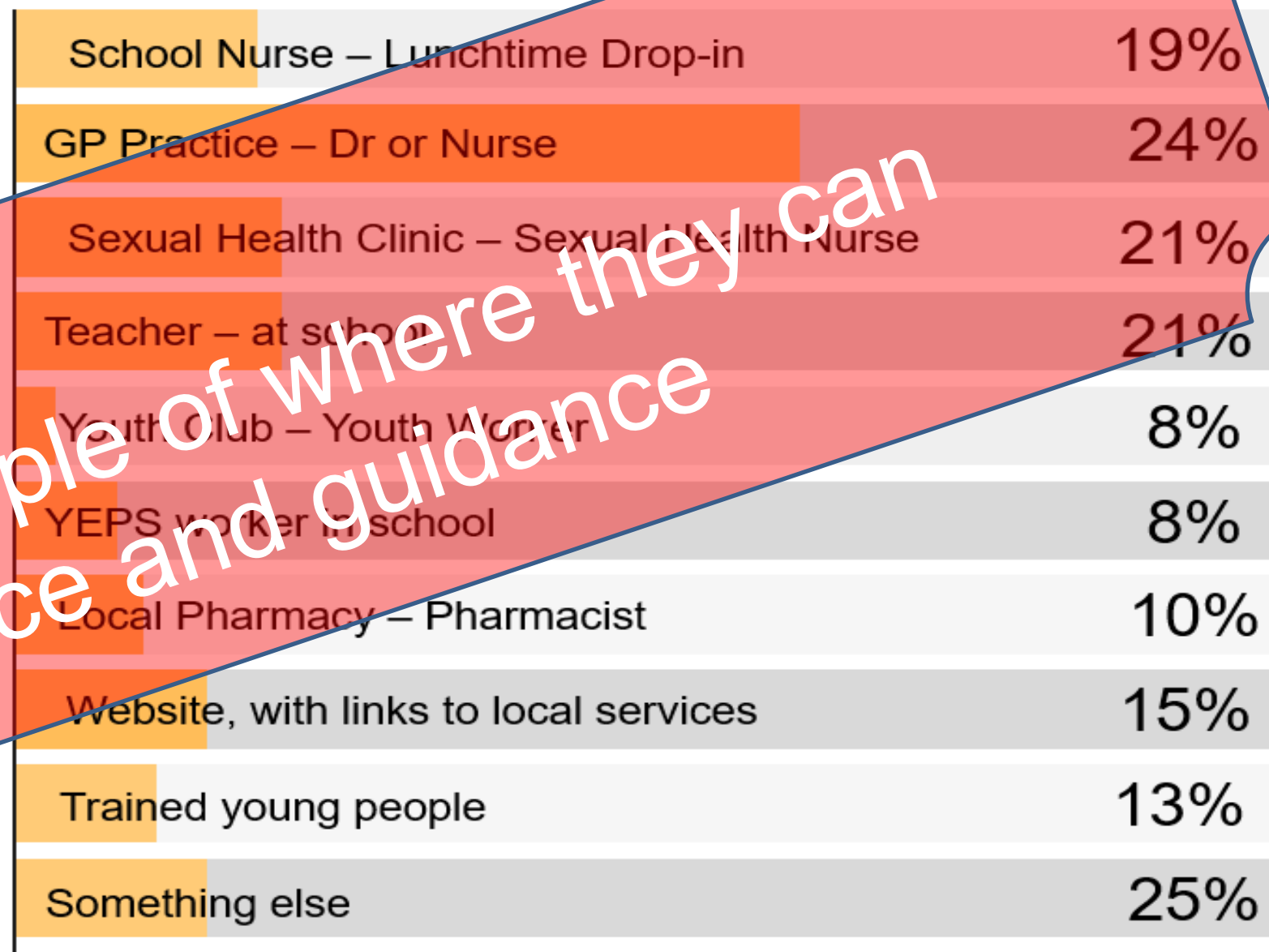

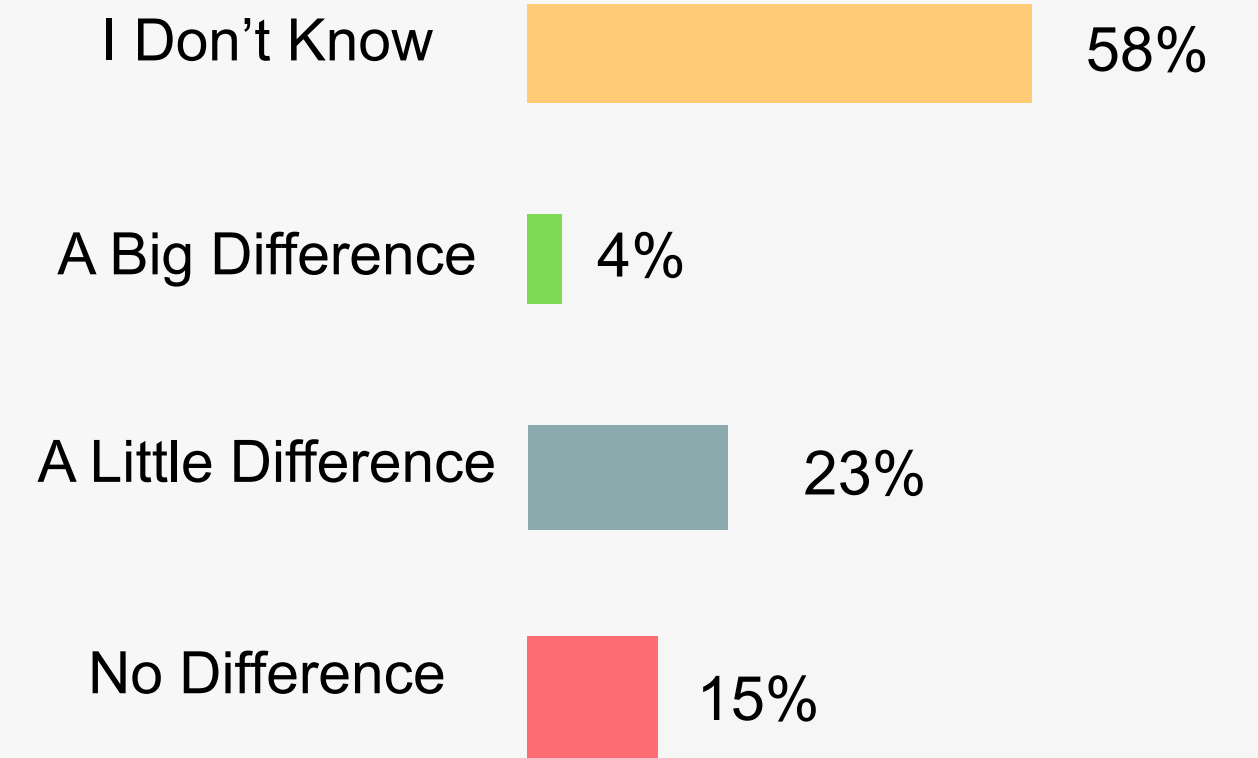

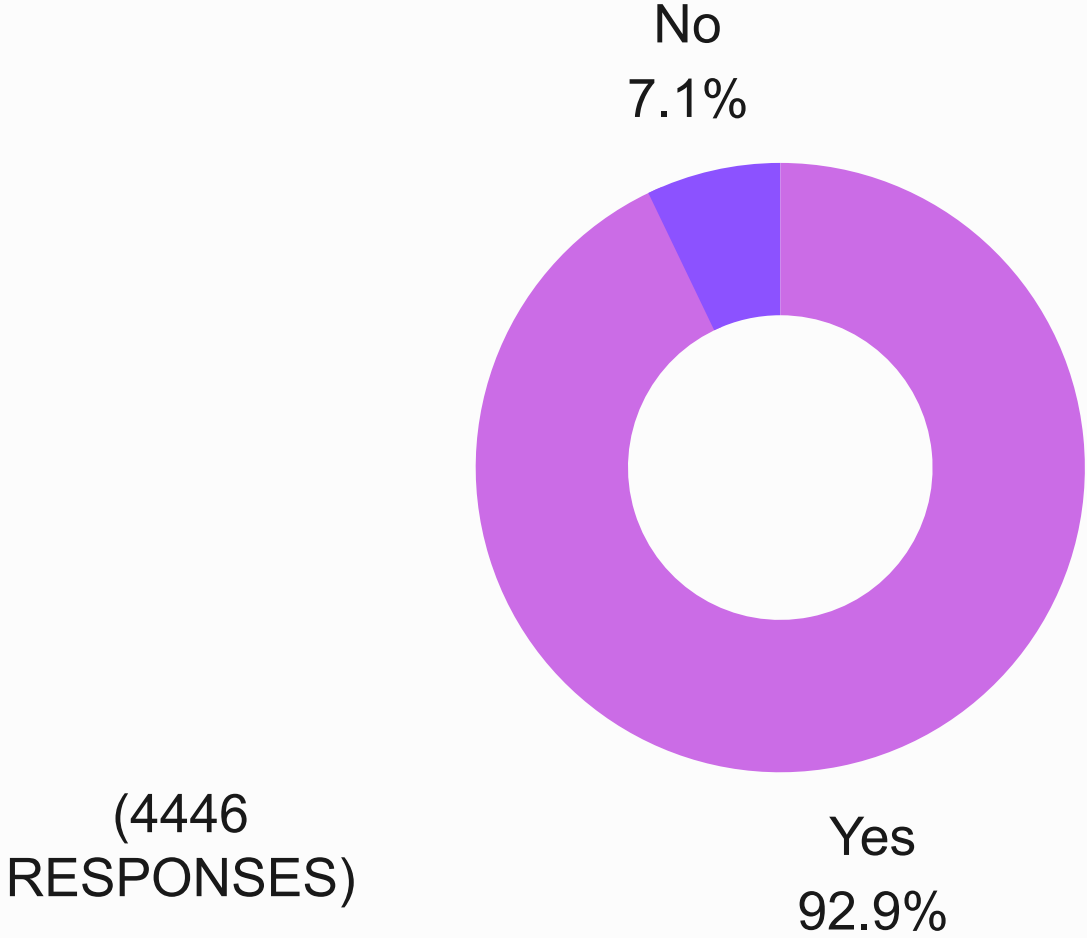
DO THEY THINK THE FORUMS HAVE MADE A DIFFERENCE?

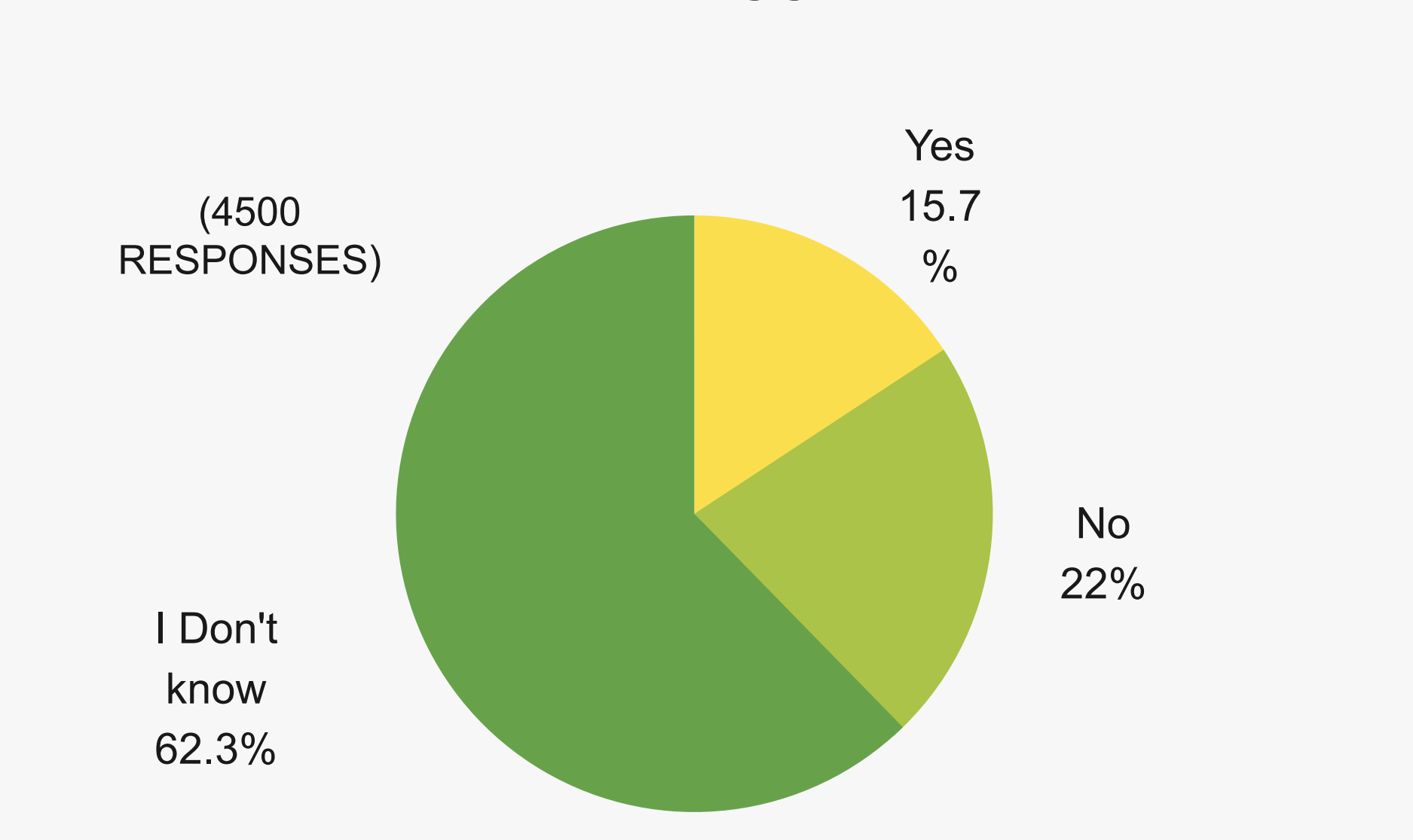

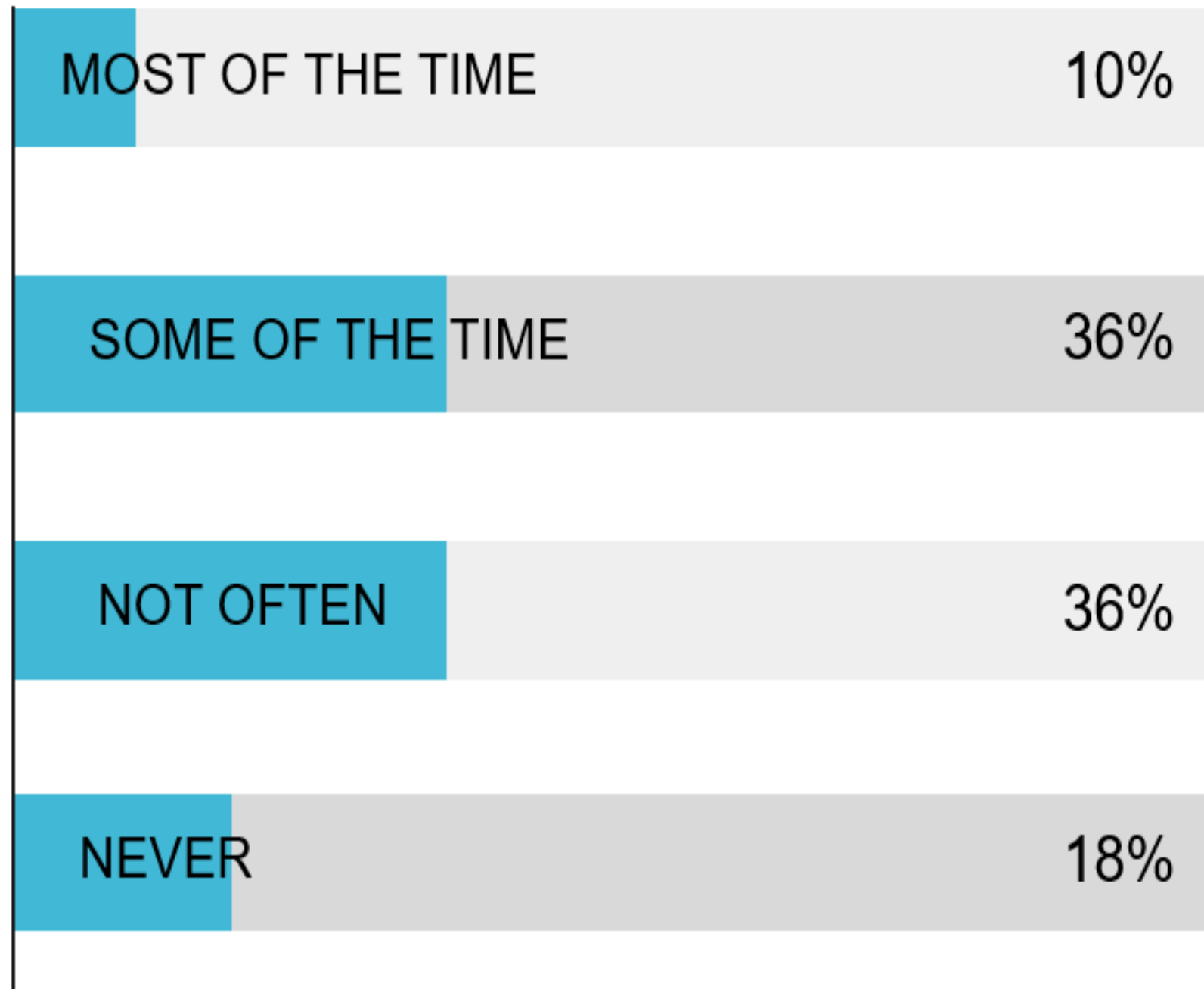
DOES YOUR SCHOOL HAVE A SCHOOL COUNCIL?



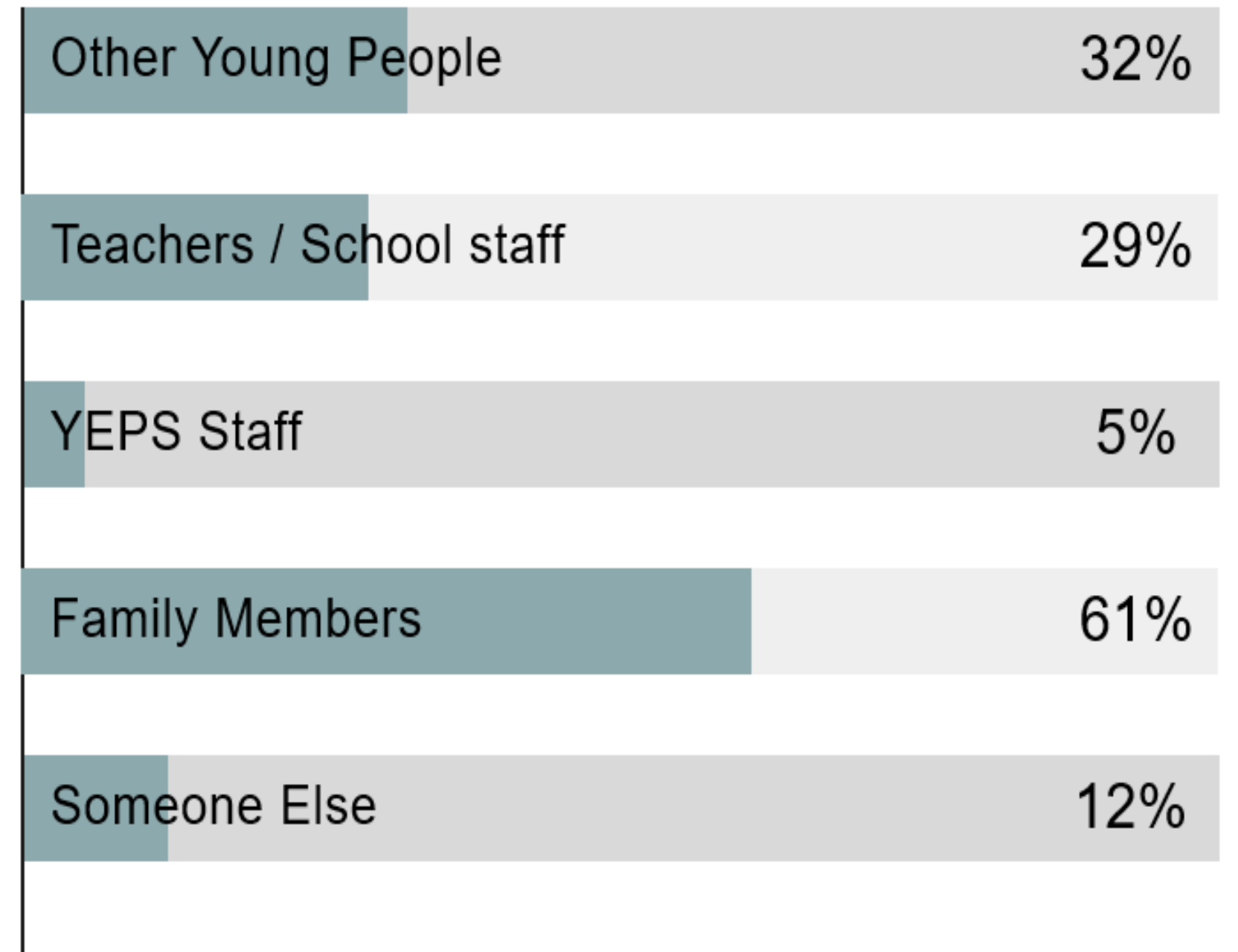

Do you get asked your views about things that affect you?

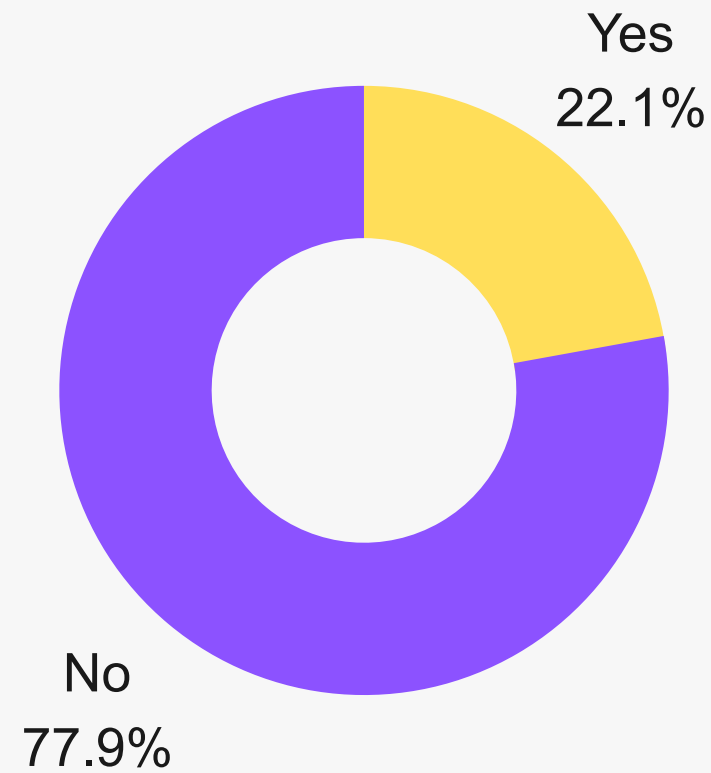

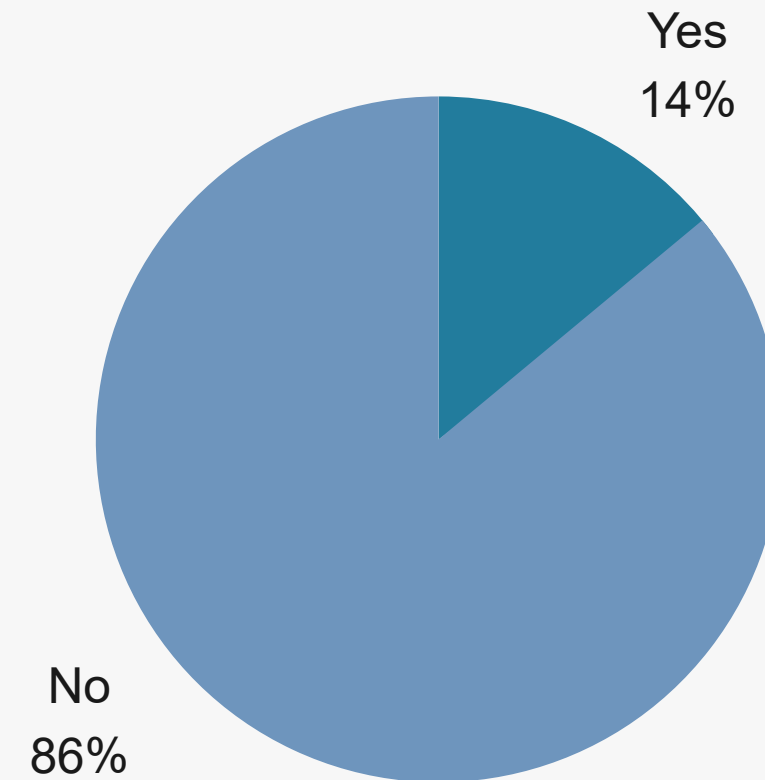

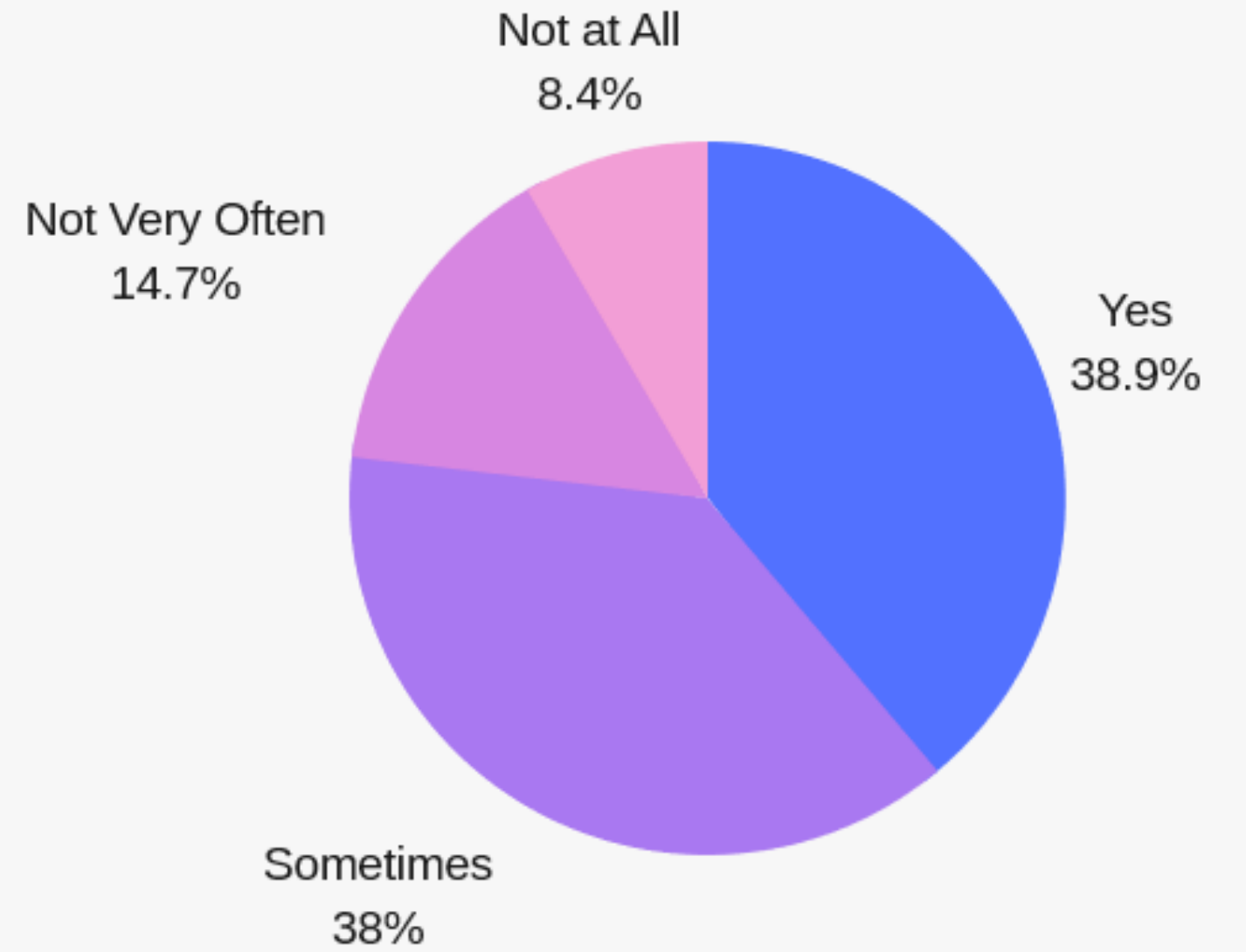

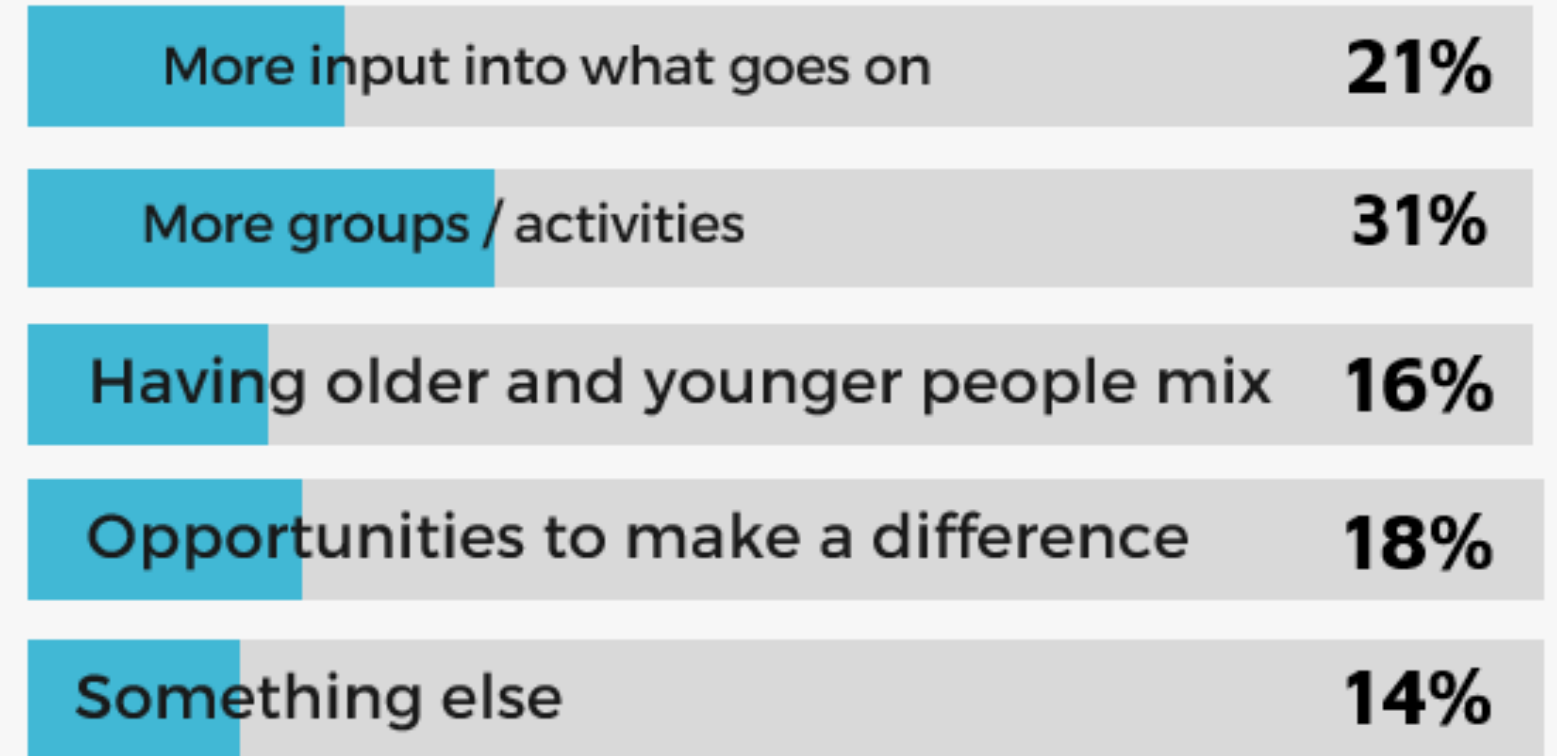
DO YOUNG PEOPLE FEEL PART OF THE COMMUNITY

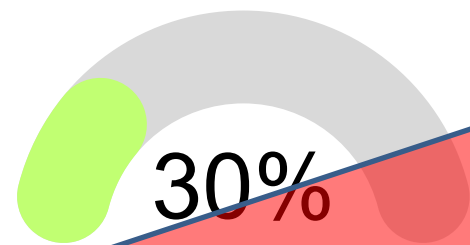

➤ Feedback to young people via youth forums, school council's, County Youth Forum and social media platforms
