# REPORT OF THE SERVICE DIRECTOR OF DEMOCRATIC SERVICES AND COMMUNICATION

## 1. PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

3.1 The need for Members to be aware of the comments and observations of the Council's Scrutiny Committees prior to their consideration of the items listed within the Cabinet agenda for the 18<sup>th</sup> December 2023.

## 4. BACKGROUND

- 4.1 In response to the <u>Local Government & Elections (Wales) Act 2021</u>, where there is now a requirement for greater consideration of Cabinet decisions in Scrutiny, the Council's Scrutiny Committees place a greater emphasis on identifying items for prescrutiny to support and improve the decision making process
- 4.2 Members are reminded that the purpose of pre- scrutiny activity is to provide the key "critical friend" challenge and influence the decisions before they are made to contribute to policy and service improvement.
- 4.3 The Council's Scrutiny Committees continue to have the opportunity to scrutinise and comment on a number of reports in advance of Cabinet's consideration to bring a different perspective to the decisions being made and enabling Cabinet decisions to

be more informed. Effective scrutiny helps support the efficient delivery of public services and drives improvements within the Council's services.

21 <sup>st</sup> November 2023		Members were pleased to see the level of engagement with the Consultation and acknowledged the valid comments that were
		provided as responses. There was some concern around the level of feedback received from tenants as a single group noting that it is important the voice of tenants is heard. There were queries around the engagement plans for future in relation to this group.
		Members noted the process of inspections and raised a concern about the involvement of residents in inspections to ensure accurate experiences are recorded.
		Members discussed the need for licensing conditions to ensure personal safety is considered within HMO's and the need to ensure safe spaces. Members felt this was an important licensing condition to be included under any future scheme.
		There was discussion of specific issues relating to Pontypridd and surrounding areas in relation to HMO's. It was felt these were longstanding issues and whilst Members recognised there is ongoing work across multi-agencies there was a concern raised that the number of students declining may be accelerated by the factor of poor standard of accommodation.
		Members discussed the process of responding to non-compliant landlords when issues are identified. Members felt the licensing scheme is a positive addition and ensuring robust and clear plans support this process.
		There was acknowledgement of the positive action of the property accreditation scheme

			but it was noted that this is voluntary. Whilst not a substitute for regulation, Members felt it is important to look to do more to encourage landlords to be part of this.
Community Services Scrutiny Committee – 21st November	Pre-Scrutiny Services offer older people	Day for	Members acknowledged the content of the report noting the background and reasons for the recommended proposals.
			Members queried the data provided in the report relating to capacity of each provision under the proposals highlighting the need that any change should not detrimentally affect current service users from attending.
			A Member queried the level of provision that would be provided to service users of Tonyrefail Day Centre and the expectation that they should receive the same standard of provision at Cwrt yr Osaf.
			A Member also raised the matter of ensuring appropriate management of the process of change for service users and staff to ensure the same level of care is provided and support for staff undergoing any service restructuring.
			A Member noted the travel time between Tonyrefail and Cwrt yr Osaf raising a concern that the increased travel time may be a barrier to current service users being able to attend the centre.
			Members also acknowledged the importance of service users being able to continue to access open spaces as part of a day centre offer.
			A Member referenced the potential for Cwrt yr Osaf to attract interest from more local residents to register to attend the day centre and the need to ensure this does not impact on individuals who are currently registered to attend in Tonyrefail.
